Join The Muddle In The Puddle Of Life

St. Dysmas Lutheran/MDSP

'We do not know what to do, but our eyes are on thee." — 2 Chronicles 20:12

The above words were spoken by King Jehoshaphat on learning that a large army of Ammonites and Moabites are on Judah's borders, and are ready to attack. A plan is needed. A decisive leader needs to take charge. Yet, his plans become prayers, and his certainty becomes despondency. How utterly biblical, yet how utterly opposite, is such an attitude to the thinking of our culture!

This verse was quoted by Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Lutheran pastor and martyr, in a sermon in 1932, before Hitler came to power in Germany. In his sermon, he notes how rare is such an attitude in a country, and even in the church. He said, "If one of our leaders stood before us at a decisive hour for our people and said, 'We don't know what we should do', we would hardly be captivated. Programs and plans don't dwindle into prayers; they stir up flames of enthusiasm for the symbols and banners of our good and just cause. At the end of our summons to action, the name of God must be invoked; God must be placed in service of our summons, our clever plans, our decisiveness.

On April 9, 1945, 68 years ago, Bonhoeffer, was hanged at Flossenburg

fore the Allies freed the prisoners. He was only 39, when the Nazis executed him. Why? Because he was part of a plot to unseat Hitler, and stop the war. Unfortunately, the Gestapo discovered the plot in 1943, and it cost Bonhoeffer

his life. Yet, in that 1932 speech, the seeds were planted that grew into his April 9 death, 68

years ago. The difference in how one makes decisions, and how one acts is the difference between thinking versus and discernment. In thinking, our attitude is what Joe Friday, in "Dragnet" says, "Just the facts, maam!". Then, on the basis of the facts, a decision is made. Such a decision requires no faith, no prayer, no pondering over Scripture, and no vulnerablilty to the support of another person. In other words, we operate no differently than an intelligent atheist.

In discernment, our signal comes from that profound verse in 2 Corinthians 5:7, "We walk by faith, not by sight". Discernment, or walking by faith, is not an excuse to turn off your brain. Instead, faith raises up a different starting place; seeking God's thoughts, before you seek your own thoughts. You pray,

before you plan. You ponder Scripture, before you check the Internet. You talk with a faith-friend, before you read the "experts".

Can such a claim be really true? What if my main question is "What is God's will?", and, "Will I follow?". Such questions can lead to a hangman's noose, or a cross. As a disciple; as a church, are we REALLY ready to be disciples wherever Jesus leads? Such questions of faith, as trust, that leads to an obedient response, now starts to become an uncomfortable idea.

How does one make this move from discernment to thinking? Our Bible verse has two pointers.

The first pointer is to begin with a humble statement, "I don't know.". Such humility acknowledges that, as a human, my knowledge, and my plans, are limited and imperfect, but God's knowledge, and God's plans, are unlimited and perfect. Like Adam and Eve in Genesis 3, we want to know, before we trust.

The second pointer is in the second half of our verse; where are we looking, to self, or Jesus? Practically, "faith-looking" means, listening to Scripture paying attention to the Spirit's movement, and listening to fellow believers. Then, if those practices aren't working, then do the loving thing, and trust that God's forgiveness is bigger than you. Trust and obey, there's no other way.

Bishop Accused Of Lying To Court

BERLIN (AP) — A German bishop already facing questions over his new multi-million euro (dollar) residence now has legal problems after prosecutors on Thursday accused him of lying to a court.

Chief Hamburg prosecutor Nana Frombach said in a statement that she had asked the court to fine Limburg Bishop Franz-Peter Tebartz-van Elst an unspecified amount for providing false testimony in a case he brought against Der Spiegel magazine.

Tebartz-van Elst's office had no comment.

Tebartz-van Elst has been under pressure over the construction of a new residence complex and related renovations that his diocese confirmed this week cost around 31 million euros (\$42 million). The Vatican had sent a senior official, Cardinal Giovanni Lajolo, to investigate

complaints. Tebartz-van Elst defended the construction in an interview printed Thursday in Bild newspaper, saying it

was really 10 projects and there were additional costs because of regulations on buildings under historical protection.

The head of the German Bishops Conference, Archbishop Robert Zollitsch, told reporters Thursday that he was following the situation with "great concern." Asked whether Tebartz-van Elst should be removed from his post, Zollitsch said he would make a recommendation to Pope Francis in Rome next

Pope Francis himself has set a new bar for modesty: He lives in a spartan suite in the Vatican hotel rather than the Apostolic Palace, eats his meals in the mediocre hotel dining room and is driven around Vatican City in a Ford Focus.

He has urged his priests to follow suit, saying he wants them to think about all the children who die of hunger when they're tempted to buy a fancy new
