"He came to our camp when he was in high school and dragged about the whole camp with him," Glenn said. "What a gem we got there, because he wasn't highly recruited.

Though he redshirted last season, Bouma proved to be the talk of practices — he was later named USD's Offensive Scout Player of the Year.


