During the week of the homecoming game against Sioux Falls O'Gorman, the Yankton football players were greeted with the following message on their team board. 'This is the week that gets us going.

Talk about prophetic.

Yankton (4-3), winners of three straight games, has vaulted itself to No. 1 in the latest sportswriters poll and up to No. 2 in the Class 11AA power points.

Perhaps most impressive is the latter ranking. Three weeks ago, the Bucks were sitting at No. 8 in the power points (which are used for playoff seedings), potentially at risk for not even making the playoffs.

And following wins over O'Gorman, Watertown and Pierre, the Bucks are in prime position to

have one — if not multiple — home games in the post-season.

Still A Lot To Be Determined For Bucks' Playoff Future

"Our confidence has been building, building, building, and I think it's at an all-time high right now," said Yankton senior lineman Steven McKee.

As it stands right now, the Bucks need a win at Harrisburg on Friday to all but assure themselves of homefield advantage in the first two rounds of the playoffs. Pierre remains ahead of Yankton in the power points, and the top two teams wouldn't play each other until the championship game.

If, for example, the Bucks would lose at Harrisburg and fall out of the top two (say, 3 or 4), they would still have another opportunity to play in front of their fans at Crane-Youngworth Field. In short, there's still a lot to decided for Yankton, even with its 3-game win streak.

But the Bucks have sure helped themselves after that win over O'Gorman three weeks ago. "Everyone had talked about beating a Sioux Falls school, but once we did that, it was like something was lifted off our shoulders," senior receiver J.J. Hejna said.
