"Just to practice this in a real-life situation, it prepares us," Paulsen said. "Everybody knows what they're doing for logistics, facility management, operations or communications. It just gets us in there under a calm atmosphere versus in a real-life situation where we'd be dealing with people who were confused or scared and all the other emotions that would take place at that point.

Participating agencies included the Yankton School District, Yankton Fire Department, Yankton Police Department, Yankton County Sheriff's Department, Yankton County EMS, Yankton County Community Health, the Mount Marty College nursing program, Bon Homme County Office of Emergency Management, Bon Homme School District, Bon Homme Community Health, Gayville Fire Department, South Dakota Department of Corrections and the Human Services Center. From these groups, 83 volunteers took part in the exercise.

Paulsen said beyond the simulation, the groups hold monthly meetings discussing preparations for such an event.

Julie DeYonge, a community health nurse and POD planner, said she believes the community will be ready to respond if an outbreak were to occur, thanks to the training they've done.

"Our group is very proactive and they like to be involved," DeYonge said. "We have a number of people who are very experienced with the command structure.'

Paulsen agreed, adding the abundance of volunteer help would boost the response capabilities.

"This is a very moderate scenario, but we realize we have a lot of volunteers," he said. "In a large-scale incident, we'd need a lot more manpower. The state actually has a volunteer database and we'd be able to access that if we needed to."

Lee Rettig, Yankton County Office of Emergency Management public information officer, said one of the qualities that makes the volunteer network effective is the ability to expand with demand.

"The beauty of the instant command system is it's expandable and contractible," Rettig said. "The capacity — (which) I wouldn't say is unlimited — can grow to accommodate a lot more people.'

YHS senior Andrew Larson said he appreciated how smoothly Wednesday's vaccination process was with the extra help, as compared to other years where standalone flu clinics were offered.

"It's a lot bigger than what they've done in the past," he said. "It's kind of nice having more stations because kids get through faster."
