## Dodgers Force Game 6 In NLCS

LOS ANGELES (AP) — It took the Dodgers five games to hit a home run in the NL championship series. Once Adrian Gonzalez powered up for the first one, their dormant offense broke loose.

Gonzalez homered twice and Zack Greinke came through with the clutch performance Los Angeles needed in a 6-4 victory over the Cardinals on Wednesday that trimmed St. Louis' lead to 3-2 in the best-of-seven play-off.

"Guys weren't ready to lose today," said Carl Crawford, who also went deep to help the Dodgers save their season.

The series shifts back to St. Louis for Game 6 on Friday night, with ace Clayton Kershaw scheduled to start for Los Angeles against rookie Michael Wacha.

When those two squared off in Game 2, the Cardinals won 1-0 on an unearned run.

"We've kind of become America's team because everyone wants to see a seventh game," Dodgers manager Don Mattingly said. "Probably even the fans in St. Louis would like to see a seventh game, so I figure that everybody's for us to win on Friday night."

The Cardinals also led last year's NLCS 3-1 before losing three straight games to the eventual World Series champion San Francisco Giants.

"We're looking to do the same thing," Gonzalez said.

Desperate to avoid elimination, the Dodgers brought in some Hollywood star power for pregame introductions. Will Ferrell announced their lineup and lent a comic spin to each player's name, capping it by introducing Greinke as "today's winning pitcher."

Ferrell knew what he was talking about.

Greinke got into a bases-loaded jam with none out in the first inning but escaped with no damage. From there, he pitched seven strong innings and even delivered an RBI single.

"That was big. I was real nervous out there with that situation," Greinke said.

A.J. Ellis also homered at Dodger Stadium, where it is tougher to clear the fences in the heavy night air.

Helped by playing in 82-degree heat on a sunny afternoon, the Dodgers rediscovered their power stroke just in time to extend the series. They held on in the ninth inning, when St. Louis scored twice off closer Kenley Jansen before he struck out pinch-hitter Adron Chambers with two on to end it.

senior Cole Hofer (18:17.77).

What he didn't expect, though, was to lead the race. "After the first half-mile, I was way back, but I started picking guys off," Haggerty said. "Then I saw the lead cart and thought, 'Wow.'"

Koerner said Freeman Academy had two runners join the team who had never run cross country or track, Schroeder and Josh Stahl (who has been out with injury).

"All of a sudden," Koerner said, "We had a full team."

And now that team is headed to the S.D. State Cross Country Meet on Oct. 26 in Rapid City.

"I'm just so excited that we can all go to state now, and not just to watch," Ryan Haggerty said. "We peaked at just the right time, I guess."

It was much the same

story in the girls' division.

Burke-South Central, which took second in last year's region meet, put five runners in the top 10 to edge Class B power Gayville-Volin by one point for first place, 17-18.

And it was all thanks to a team motto that was seen on the Cougars' sweatshirts: "Nothing great happens when you hold back."

"When you're a distance runner, you can't hold anything back," Burke-South Central coach Laurie Kenzy said. "You have a lot of time to think out there."

"But we talk all the time about thinking team first. That helps take some of the pressure off."

The Cougars needed such a packed finish to beat the Raiders, who had the top two finishers in champion Laura Nelson (14:55.88) and Genevieve Clark (15:28.28).

Freeman's Rebecca Eberts came in third at 16:14.28, followed by Burke-South Central eighth-grader Lexie Fernau (16:25.63).

"It's a great feeling," Fernau said. "We have such a good team, and we had a great year."

"We had the feeling that we could get maybe catch them."

The Cougars also had the 8-9-10 finishers, with Shailyn Schweigert, Allison Sebern and Ryahna Schweigert, respectively.

After the race, every Burke-South Central runner could be seen wearing those sweatshirts with the telling message.

"It was a good comparison tonight," Climer said. "We're right there with them. We should be beating some of the other teams. I'm hoping that opens their eyes now, because I told them they can't hang their heads on this one. There's no way."

The Lancers drop to 10-15 in the season and 0-9 in the GPAC. Northwestern improves to 25-1 and 9-0 in the GPAC.

Karl Schut led the Red Raiders with 16 kills and eight digs, while Kaitlin Floerchinger had nine kills. Kellie Goedken put up eight kills

in the in. Brooke Fessler had a total of 37 assists and 11 digs. Alexis Bart also contributed seven digs.

Bailey Kuchta led MMC with 10 kills and six digs, while Allison Cross had 31 assists and six digs on the night, with Courtney Miller putting up a total of 11 digs. Grosteth also had six digs.

"Most of the time is was us: pass, set kill; them: pass, set kill; and I'm fine with that — that's the game," Climer said. "That's what I asked them to do during that second and third set: Just get a couple more digs on them and we can stay ahead of them."

Climer is now looking to contend with Presentation at home Friday, and Concordia on Saturday on the road, she said.
