Child Abuse A Terrible Tragedy

The recent death of a child due to apparent assault in Sioux Falls is horrifying. It doesn't matter if the child's father is a celebrity or unheard of, the fact that a child has died in a violent way at the hands of an adult is unacceptable. If we are people of faith, we entrust the child to the hands of a loving God, and pray that God will comfort all of those who grieve this terrible loss. While some say that this terrible loss is overplayed by the media, one would hope that heightened awareness might prevent more tragedy. While some say, "It takes a village to raise a child." I would say, "It takes parents to protect children." While some say, "Think of children first." I would say, "As far as earthly priorities go, think of your children, first, second and third." Parents cannot simply balance their children's needs with their own

needs, but when it comes to keeping their children safe, they must make their children a priority that will not be compromised. No exceptions. If someone is unwilling to make that sort of commitment, they should postpone becoming a parent. Most caution must be taken in choosing who will be entrusted with the care of your children. Do an abundance of homework before choosing a daycare provider. If you don't live with the child's other parent, find out who else is in the home when they visit. Just because you have been dating someone for a few weeks and they seem terrific does not mean that they should watch your children. Remember, you are see-

ing them on their best behavior. They want to impress you. Few first dates begin with honest discussion of anger management issues, prior assault charges or restraining orders. If you suspect child abuse or neglect, please do the right thing and report it. In Yankton County, call 668-3030. The vast majority of people would not hurt a child. Unfortunately, there are a few people who do hurt children. Let us make our homes, our community and our state safe places for children to live, play and grow. Let us teach our children to be confident, to trust when it is appropriate and to be careful when it is necessary. In memory of those children who have lost their lives, and for the sake of those who continue to live in the terrible shadow of abuse, let us resolve to do what is necessary to protect our children.

The presenters will share insights taken from the Council documents and will expound on the three basic principles that underlie the Council: "re-sourcement" (return to our roots),

"aggiornamento" (appropriate renewal) and "development" (deepening and growth in understanding of revelation). Spiritual renewal, to use the Council's words, "draws the faithful into the compelling love of Christ and sets them afire." All are welcome to attend this free event. Event coordinator, Sr. Marielle Frigge says, "This is a wonderful opportunity to hear about Vatican II from a Bishop who experienced it first hand — especially meaningful for those who don't remember the Council years or the liturgy and practices of the Church pre-Vatican II."
