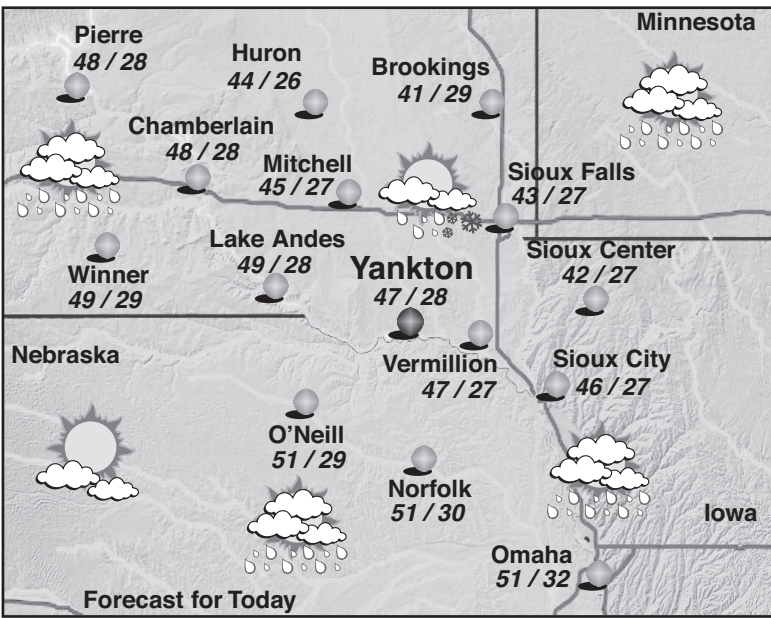

would come over shortly after the fall of the Berlin Wall," Jerke said. "They wanted to introduce to the young folks of (former) East Germany what it was like in a democracy, so the German government would provide airfare and we would host them for up to 10 days."

The menu for this year's celebration includes German sausage, liverwurst, apfel mousse (baked apples), German kartoffel salat (German potato salad), sauerkraut, cheeses and crackers, buns, pickled watermelon and a salad bar. Dessert will feature kuchen, which is the official dessert of South Dakota. In addition, a bake sale will also be part of the festivities and people will have the chance to win door prizes throughout the night.

Jerke said for entertainment, this will be the first year a local act will be featured at the event.

"For the past few years we've had Oktoberfest-style entertainment from Minnesota," he said. "Somebody said our musicians are every bit as capable of performing and doing a good job as people from other states. So this year will be the first time with a local group (performing)."

That local group is The BumbleBees of Tyndall. Consisting of 12 musicians from Nebraska and South Dakota, the band aims to bring a "Branson-style" show to the stage.

Jerke said as of Tuesday, a little more than 400 of the 500 tickets allotted have been sold. He added they are in contact with a group from Germany to come to next year's Oktoberfest celebration.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly higher Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery rose 1 cent to \$7.0075 a bushel; December corn fell 5.75 cents to 4.3825 a bushel; December oats were 4.75 cents higher at \$3.4125 a bushel; while November soybeans fell 1 cent to \$13.0225 a bushel.

Beef and pork rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle rose 1.07 cents to \$1.3297 a pound; November feeder cattle was 1.45 cents higher at \$1.6785 a pound; while December lean hogs rose 1.10 cents to \$.8857 a pound.

Post Office Auction Set To Close Nov. 12

The new closing date for the online auction of the Yankton Post Office is Nov. 12.

The auction was put on hiatus during the recent federal government shutdown.

The U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) site RealEstateSales.gov also says an open house will be held at the facility from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Nov. 6. The auction will close at 2 p.m. Nov. 12.

The downtown Yankton post office was closed in January 2012 and put up for sale. Postal operations were consolidated into the annex at 506 West 25th Street. That facility was built in 2000.

Gavins Point Boat Ramp To Close Today

The Gavins Point Boat Ramp at Lewis & Clark Recreation Area will be closed starting Thursday, Oct. 24, for a dredging project that will last approximately three weeks.
