Comedian Ken Davis To Present Nov. 1 Show To Benefit 'Kids Against Hunger'

In order to help feed those in need locally and internationally, Yankton's Kids Against Hunger is asking people to join them in a night of laughter.

Popular comedian Ken Davis will perform at 7 p.m. Friday, Nov. 1, in the Yankton High School/Summit Activities Center Theater.

"We have heard Ken in previous years," said Steve Mach, the Yankton director of Kids Against Hunger. "He is a very funny comedian that the whole family can enjoy, and also is a great communicator and inspirational speaker. He is very well known throughout the United States, so we knew that families would travel a distance to come and see him live."

In addition to doing comedy and inspirational speeches, Davis is an author, and a frequent radio and television guest. His radio show, "Lighten up," is heard on more than 1,500 stations.

Efforts by the *Press & Dakotan* to reach Davis for an interview this week were unsuccessful.

Last year, he spoke with Willowcreek.org about what makes comedy such a powerful tool.

"We live in a humorless society," Davis said. "Everybody is offended by everything. And sadly, we Christians often lead that flag-waving army. Comedy gives us a way to tell a story and reveal truth that, if done right, is non-threatening to listeners. It's disarming. Much of my comedy is self-realization — making fun of myself, which makes it safe for the listener to learn the same things I am learning. Comedy opens people's hearts to hear God's truth.

"Humor also is powerful because it demands a response," he added. "As a communicator, you know right away if you made the connection with your audience. Teachers who don't use humor have no idea if they are connecting. Those who use humor know instantly whether or not they've made that connection."
