flood plain designation has made it unfeasible to build a new home on Wildwood Park Addition lots, due to site elevation requirements. Kabella said he built a shed on his property that he believes is allowed as an exempt structure of less than 120 square feet.

Commissioner Freng said exempt structures are intended to be sheds or playhouses and not to be used as residences. Kabella said he spends a lot of time at the shed, but does not live in it.

Tim Floen purchased Lot 24 in Wildwood Park Addition in 2013. He has a flood plain development permit. Floen said an exempt shed was built on his property in 2011 before he purchased it. Floen said he parks a camper on the lot, but keeps it covered when his family is not using it. Floen said he plans to build a house on the property within 3-5 years.

Mike McHenry purchased Lot 19 in Wildwood Park Addition in 2012. McHenry said he parks his camper on the lot. He said he built a fence and placed a sunshade and portable toilet on the property. McHenry said he occupies the camper fewer than 14 nights per year. McHenry said he painted the portable toilet in camouflage colors and has it pumped out regularly by a sanitary service.

Tim Miller has owned a house on Lot 12 in Wildwood Park Addition since 2003. Miller said he understands the 2010 flood plain designation has lowered property values and makes it unlikely any new houses will be built in the said he does not believe that change means the subdivision should now be turned into a campground.

Randy Hlavac purchased Lot 11 in Wildwood Park Addition in 2012. He has a flood plain development permit. Hlavac said he parks his camper on the lot. but occupies it fewer than 14 nights per year. Hlavac said he has a portable toilet on the lot that is pumped as needed by a sanitary service.

Sue Chaney and her husband have owned a home on Lots 40 and 41 in Wildwood Park since 1997. Chaney said they plan to sell their house soon and move to Yankton. She said an attorney informed her that flood plain restrictions, combined with adjacent landowners out of compliance with zoning re-
