CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were lower Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery fell 9.75 cents to \$6.81 a bushel; December corn fell 9.25 cents to 4.3075 a bushel; December oats were 5 cents lower at \$3.2825 a bushel; while November soybeans declined 28.75 cents to \$12.7125 a bushel. Beef and pork higher on the

Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle rose .83 cent to \$1.3380 a pound; November feeder cattle was .42 cent higher at \$1.6707 a pound; while December lean hogs rose 1.53 cents to \$.9195 a pound.
