Chuck Morrell Named AD At Montana Tech

BUTTE, Montana — Montana Tech has added athletic director to the duties of Bon Homme graduate Chuck Morrell, the institution announced on Thursday.

Morrell, who has served as head football coach for the Orediggers since December of 2010, will continue to coach the football team. He replaces Dave Lau, who resigned as AD after just three months, citing family reasons.

Morrell coached the Orediggers to the 2012 Frontier Conference championship, earning him Frontier Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year honors.

Morrell was defensive coordinator at the University of South Dakota in the 2010 season. Prior to that, he coached at the University of Sioux Falls from 1998-2009, helping the Cougars win three national titles and play in four NIAA championship games.

As a player, Morrell was the leading tackler on USF's 1996 NIAA championship team.

U of M Students Angered By Ticket Bundling Policy

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — A student leader at the University of Minnesota is trying to change a policy that forces students to buy football season passes to get tickets to other sports.

The Student Senate on Thursday approved a resolution drafted by student senator Kyle Kroll that asks the administration to end the ticket bundling. The second-year law student says it is unfair that Gopher Athletics is making students buy more tickets than they want or can afford.

Senior Associate Athletic Director Chris Werle says the new practice, which began this summer, is a way to reward the best of U of M sports fans. Students who purchased the football season pass got first pick for other sports.

Minnesota Public Radio News reports the university used to allow students to buy tickets for individual sports.
