Halftime Almost Over For Pioneer Day

A homecoming halftime lasting nearly 17 days comes to an end on Monday. Yankton's Pioneer Day game with Aberdeen Central on Sept. 19 was stopped at halftime due to lightning. After a few days of debate, it was finally decided that the game would be completed Oct. 6 at Ab-

What followed was a lot of debate by Yankton fans about how a Yankton home game would get moved 250 miles away, even overshadowing talk of playing longtime rival Sioux Falls O'Gorman. Then the Bucks put together their exciting overtime victory over the Knights. Yankton followed it up with a 30-0 shutout of Watertown, another longtime rival, for the first Buck shutout in 18 games.

While fans may have been distracted by the circumstances surrounding the Aberdeen Central game, the Bucks have shown that they were not, continuing a start that has the Bucks off to their first 5-0 start since 2012 and with the potential for much more.

Yankton had started 5-0 in both 2011 and 2012, but neither of those seasons had the feel that this one does. First off, those seasons had back-loaded schedules, with four-game stretches that included Sioux Falls Roosevelt, Sioux Falls Washington and Brandon Valley to end the regular season. In each season the Bucks went 0-3 in those games and saw their season end at Sioux Falls O'Gorman in the plavoffs

But this year, the Bucks have already beaten both Brandon Valley and O'Gorman, have no possibility of seeing them again in the post-season. Yankton came from behind in both of those teams and beat both of them in overtime, showing a will and determination that had been missing in recent years.

Yankton will be trailing when it takes the field against Aberdeen Central on Monday, 20-17, and will kick off to the Golden Eagles when the game restarts at 4 p.m. A three-point deficit might not be as difficult as having just 48 hours to recover mentally and physically from having played Friday. (Aberdeen Central will have no such issues, coming off their bye.)

This Bucks team, though, has shown it is capable of overcoming the obsticles in front of them. I'm sure we'll see the same determination in Aberdeen on Monday ... and the rest of the season.
