service providers. "The key to this part of the pilot is the creation of a child/family position, which Jennifer Powell has been hired to fill," Stanaage said. "Jennifer will take the lead in establishing mechanisms to allow for increased communication, collaboration in goal setting and service coordination. Jennifer will be placed in the school and is intended to be a resource for teachers, counselors and administrators."

Kindle noted that while Powell will be an employee of LCBHS, she will be a highly utilized resource for the school. "She will be in our schools throughout the YSD coordinating meetings and services on most days during the school year," he said. "She will also be providing time outside of school to accommodate the needs of our families. The liaison position will help coordinate a team approach of care between the Yankton School District, Lewis and Clark Behavioral Health Services, Court Services, Department of Social Services and other agencies working with the child and family. We really want to prevent an out-of-home placement if possible."

Wrap-around training will begin this Thursday and Friday. Stanaage noted that funding for the programs was the result of a series of meetings initiated by Lt. Gov. Matt Michels.

"He initially brought a group of us together and challenged us to come up with some ideas to improve the existing behavioral health services for kids and families," Stanaage said. "Funding in the amount of \$280,000 over two years has been made available through the Attorney General's Office as a result of a lawsuit having to do with the alleged improper marketing of the antipsychotic drug, Risperdal. This is particularly appropriate for children's behavioral health because the lawsuit was based, in part, on the allegation of improper marketing for children."

The second part of the program, Functional Family Therapy (FFT), focuses on the children at high risk of school failure, out-of-home placement or who are returning from out-of-home placement.

"Part two is a new pilot program that has not been offered before," Stanaage said. "The key to this aspect of the pilot is an intensive training process for LCBHS staff that started at the end of August. This part of the pilot is based on an evidenced-based practice called Functional Family Therapy (FFT)."

Stanaage said the Functional Family Care therapy will consist of three therapists who can each see up to 30 families. "In the long run, we will be able to assist 90 families," he said. "We will build to that number; it won't all happen at once. Our goal is to try to keep the kids that end up in out-of-home placements down. FFT has demonstrated that reducing the difficulties that kids are having helps the families."

Kindle said that a referral process is being discussed and will be finalized at the meetings later this week for determining which students should be involved.

Stanaage noted that most pilot programs of this size would be tested in Sioux Falls or Rapid City, and that the state is watching to see what kind of results will be achieved.

"Being in the Yankton area, with all of the mental health professionals here, and in Vermillion with the University of South Dakota gives us a tremendous advantage of pulling in staff and completing training," he said. "In some ways, we are more like Sioux Falls because of the advantages we have, but we are a small town that, hopefully, we will be better able to transition our results out to other communities because we are more on a size with them."

Kindle noted that it is the only program of its kind in the state.

Stanaage summed up the two programs with a simple statement. "Much like most programs, none of this works unless we are all working together," he said. "It takes a will- ingness on the part of the school district, agencies and LCBH to make this all work."

of visitors we saw."

She added that while she did not have official numbers for the Cottonwood Campground or the Nebraska Tailwaters Campground, she knew that there wasn't a weekend that they were not near capacity this summer.

"I have been a park ranger for 25 years. I just keep seeing the camping numbers going up and up and up," she noted. "We just have a phenomenal recreational area located right here at the border of Nebraska and South Dakota. In the scheme of things, this is not a very big national park and we are based in a very rural area. The fact that we have all of this to do around here is just awesome. This is one of the premier recreational areas in the Great Plains."

Bertsch said that as a member of the staff it makes him very proud to hear the comments of visitors saying the campgrounds in the area are the nicest people have ever been to. A fact he says correlates with the number of repeat visitors the area sees. "We had 152,205 people take advantage of the Lewis and Clark Recreational area this summer," he said. "We are seeing a lot of families taking their vacations here. The kids and parents alike are enjoying our naturalists pro-

grams, our archer programs. There is something for everyone with the boating, lake use, trails, hiking — you name it — we offer it."

He did note that the district was down in numbers when it came to physical count of people entering the campgrounds. The district counted 1,054,882 visitors, a 12 percent decrease over last year.

"I know visitation was down a little," he said. "But we did have a lot of cooler weekends which decreased the number of people coming in just for the day. I would say that all the decreases were weather related. We didn't get the high 90s that we usually do."

However, he added camping has continued into October, with approximately 250 camping units utilized last weekend. In addition, while some of the areas of the district campgrounds will be winterized and closed to public use, there will be limited camping though November and cabins available for rental throughout the winter.

- A faulty traffic stop over a car's broken brake light in North Carolina.
• The use of a law to prevent document shredding against a fisherman accused of throwing undersized red grouper overboard.
• The prosecution of a self-styled rapper whose Facebook postings threatened his estranged wife, an FBI agent and area schools.
