**Yankton Youth  
To Celebrate  
National 4-H Week**

More than 6 million young people across the country this week will celebrate National 4-H Week, an annual celebration of 4-H during the first full week of October. Yankton 4-H will leverage National 4-H Week this year to showcase the great things that 4-H offers young people and highlight the incredible 4-H youth in the community who work each day to make a positive impact on the community.

On Thursday, Oct. 9, from 4:30-7 p.m., Yankton County 4-H will host an open house at the Yankton County Extension Office, 901 Whiting Drive. All youth, ages 5 and above, and their parents in Yankton County are invited to attend.

Frozen ice cream treats will be available, while current 4-H members and 4-H leaders host activities and games to showcase what 4-H is all about.

"The 4-H program is unlike many of the other youth development activities available in this area," said Stephanie Siebrandt, 4-H youth development programming assistant. "4-H involves interests of all kinds and encourages families to work together. No matter what you are interested in or like doing, there are opportunities for you in 4-H."

For example, in Yankton County, the Shooting Sports 4-H club has grown tremendously in the last couple years. The members of this club work with adult volunteers to learn safety and decision-making skills while learning proper shooting technique with various kinds of guns and with archery.

The areas of robotics, consumer decision making and

livestock judging are also growing and evolving in Yankton County.

Research has proven that participation in 4-H has a significant positive impact on young people. Recent findings from the Tufts University "4-H Study of Positive Youth Development" indicate that, when compared to their peers, young people in 4-H are:

- Nearly four times more likely to contribute to their communities,
- Two times more likely to pursue healthy behaviors like, and
- Two times more likely to engage in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) programs in the out-of-school time.

In Yankton, more than 150 4-H youth and 30 volunteers from the community are involved in 4-H.

Also during National 4-H Week, youth from the Yankton area will join hundreds of thousands of youth from all around the nation to complete a single, innovative experiment for 4-H National Youth Science Day.

The 2014 National Science Experiment Rockets to the Rescue, will task youth to design and build an aerodynamic food transportation device that can deliver a payload of nutritious food to fictitious disaster victims. Youth will learn engineering concepts, develop math skills, learn about nutrition and help solve a relevant, global issue.

Youth in the Yankton area participated in this experiment on Monday, Sept. 6, at the Yankton Community Library.

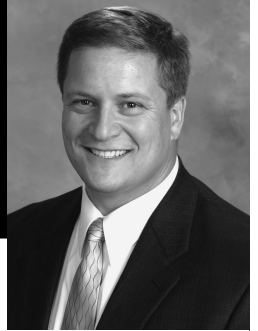
