# **SDSU Women Picked To Win Summit League**

ELMHURST, III. - South Dakota State was selected to capture the 2014-15 Summit League women's basketball championship after winning its third consecutive regular season title a year ago The Jackrabbits collected 27-of-32 first-place votes and 513 points in a vote of the league's head coaches, SIDs and select media.

Western Illinois' Ashley Luke was tabbed as the preseason Player of the Year.

South Dakota, last season's tournament champion, earned four first-place votes and 420 points to place second in the poll. Regular season runner-up IUPUI was in third place followed by Western Illinois in fourth with the final first-place tally. Denver, which finished second at the tournament a year ago, came in fifth while Fort Wayne placed sixth. Oral Roberts, which returns to the league for the first time since 2011-12, Omaha and North Dakota State rounded out the poll.

Luke becomes Western Illinois' first Preseason Player of the Year selection since former WNBA draft choice and Olympian Zane Teilane in 2005-06. The junior was named to The Summit League First Team and All-Tournament Team last season while averaging 20.8 points and 10.5 rebounds per game.

Joining Luke on the first team are reigning Newcomer of the Year in North Dakota State's Brooke LeMar, IUPUI's Nevena Markovic, South Dakota's Nicole Seekamp, Fort Wavne's Halev Seibert and South Dakota State's Megan Wavtashek

South Dakota also put Raeshel Contreras and Tia Hemiller on the second team.

# **SDSU's Wieneke Named To Rice Watch List**

PHILADELPHIA — South Dakota State Univer-sity wide receiver Jake Wieneke was named Wednesday to the initial watch list for the Jerry Rice Award, which is presented to the top freshman in the Football Championship Subdivision.

A redshirt freshman from Maple Grove, Minnesota. Wieneke has recorded two 100-vard receiving games so far this season. He opened his collegiate career by catching six passes for 107 yards, including a 45-yarder in the third quarter, in

the Jackrabbits' season opener at nationally ranked Missouri. Wieneke became the first Jackrabbit freshman in the Division I era to top the 100-yard receiving mark in a game, and the first since current receivers coach Josh Davis accomplished the feat three times during the 2002 season

Wieneke followed his debut with two catches for 37 yards and his first collegiate touchdown -11-yard reception in the third quarter against an Cal Poly. He also gained 52 yards on a lateral. Wieneke's second 100-yard outing came in a losing effort at Illinois State as he caught seven passes for 116 yards, including a 26-yard touch-

For the season, Wieneke is averaging 19.5 vards every time he touches the ball as he has tallied a team-best 338 receiving vards on 19 recept tions (17.8 ypr) and added a 52-yard rush in the Sept. 6 win over Cal Poly. Wieneke ranks second on the team with his 19 receptions and shares the team lead with three touchdown catches.

Wieneke is the third Jackrabbit in the four seasons the Jerry Rice Award has been presented to be under consideration for the award, joining Austin Sumner (2011) and T.J. Lally (2012).

The watch list will be updated periodically through the remainder of the 2014 regular season. The winner of the Jerry Rice Award will be announced at The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation Dec. 15 in Philadelphia.

Avera St. Luke's Hospital in Aberdeen held a ceremonial groundbreaking Tuesday for the \$13.5 million Don and Carmen Meyer Center of Excellence, which will be home to the Avera Cancer Institute

Mever was one of the winningest coaches in college basketball history, compiling 923 victories in 38 seasons at Northern State University in Aberdeen, Lipscomb University in Nashville, and Hamline University in St. Paul, Minnesota. The native of Wayne, Nebraska, died in May after a long battle with cancer, at the age of 69.


