Gazelles Sweep Past Mitchell

In an Eastern South Dakota Conference showdown, the Yankton Gazelles were able to stampede past the Mitchell Kernels in three sets on Thursday evening at the Summit Center in Yank-ton. The scores were 25-12, 26-24, 25-19. "I was happy with the level of play."

Yankton head coach Tiffany Beste said. "We did just about everything right in set one and in set two, we kind of lost focus. We always knew we were good enough to come back, but in set three we were able to get some other girls on the court, which was great.'

Even in the loss, Mitchell head coach Deb Thill was impressed with her team's effort.

"We played 100 times better than Tuesday night," she said. "That was our main goal, we also wanted to do something better with the mental aspect of the game. I think that they did a really

nice job."

The Gazelles (6-8, 5-6 in ESD) started the contest on a roll. After a 4-0 run, Yankton took an 11-4 lead during the first timeout.

Thanks to great play around the net, Yankton was able to claim a 25-12 victory in set one.

Thill was looking for more ball movement from her team.

We needed to pass the ball more and get the ball to our playmakers," she said. "That's what it comes down to in a game like this."

After a 7-3 start for the Gazelles, Mitchell (1-12, 0-11 in ESD) took Thill's advice and earned its first lead of the contest at 14-12.

Both teams went back and forth throughout the set, but the Gazelles won 26-24 by winning the last three points.

Beste and the Yankton coaching staff have been stressing the defensive aspect of the game.

"We have been stressing defense in practice a lot recently," she said. "In the first half of the season we stressed offense. But tonight, we had girls get to balls that they haven't gotten to all season.

In the last set, Yankton extended a 16-7 lead. However, Mitchell would not go down quietly into the night, as the Kernels inched to a 23-17 deficit.

The Gazelles front play proved to be too much for the Kernels, as they took the third set 25-19.

"We had chances to win," Thill said. "The first set was rough, but in the second and third sets we competed. We gave ourselves a chance to win."

Beste was impressed with her team's net play and the serving ability.

"I thought we blocked well and served aggressively," she said. "At the net, we swung hard and couldn't really stop us. If we can get the ball to their

RAPID CITY — The Yankton Gazelles sit in 11th after the opening day of the South Dakota State Girls' Tennis Tournament, which began on Thursday in Rapid City.

Sioux Falls Lincoln, Sioux Falls O'-Gorman and St. Thomas More each have a perfect 300 points after the opening day. Rapid City Stevens is in fourth at 260, followed by Eastern South Dakota Conference champion Brandon Valley at 228.

Yankton scored 100 points on the opening day. Vermillion was scoreless on the opening day, but remains alive in consolation singles action today (Friday).

"Everyone did what they were supposed to do," said Yankton head coach Matt Termansen. "They played really well toward the end of matches, especially one doubles, six singles and four singles — they got

down early and came back and won matches."

Yankton freshman Anne Knoff opened flight five singles play with a decisive 6-1, 6-1 victory of Madison's Lacee Fedeler. The second-seeded Knoff will face Lincoln's Kaitlin Olson, an upset winner over Brandon Valley's Logan Hawkins, in the quarterfinals today.

Yankton's Sarah Rockne and Kaitlyn Frank advanced to the quarterfinals of flight one doubles with a 1-6, 6-3, (10-6) victory over Brandon Valley. The Gazelles draw second-seeded St. Thomas More next.

"We got a big upset win at flight one doubles. They beat a Brandon Valley team that had they had lost to twice this year," Termansen said. "Now they're going against an extremely tough St. Thomas More team, whose only loss is to O'Gorman.'

At flight two doubles, Yankton's Kim Cap and Anna Kokesh beat Vermillion's Rosdail and Brandi Styles 7-5, 6-1 in the first round, then fell to St. Thomas More 6-1, 6-1 in the second round. They bounced back with a 10-8 victory over Rapid City Central, and will face Aberdeen Roncalli in the consolation quarterfinals today.

At flight three doubles, Yankton's Knoff and Mimi Garcia dropped a 6-2, 6-2 decision to Watertown in the second round. The duo will face Aberdeen Central in the consolation quarterfinals today.

At flight one singles, Rockne dropped a 6-1, 6-3 decision to Roncalli's Erica Carrels in the second round. She will play in the consolation quarterfinals today.

Maddie Logue dropped a 6-0, 6-0 decision to Milbank's Gretchen Biersbach at flight two singles. She will
