
COYOTE OFFENSE VS. UNI DEFENSE

Quick Hitters

South Dakota State running back Zach Zenner needs just 94 yards to move into the top-10 in career rushing at the FCS level. The career rushing leader in the MVFC, he also ranks 16th all-time in FCS career all-purpose yards with 6,703.

Missouri State left tackle Zack Cooley will make his 40th consecutive start for the Bears today.

Missouri State receiver Julian Burton has a string of 25 consecutive games with at least one catch. He needs two catches and 38 receiving vards to crack the Bears' career top-5 in each category.

Yankton native Kellen Soulek

leads the Jackrabbits with two sacks on the season.

Despite just giving up 14 points in a loss to Missouri State last week, the Bears rank 9th in the MVFC in points allowed per game at 22.4. SDSU is just ahead of them at 22 points allowed per game.

South Dakota State will dedicate its new Sanford-Jackrabbit Athletic Complex at 3 p.m. today. The building will serve as an indoor practice facility for the football team.

SDSU will also honor its incoming Hall of Fame class at halftime: Jerry Smith (wrestling), Craig Cassen (track/XC), Tara Tessier (basketball) and Rod DeHaven (track/XC).

Key Matchup

Quick Hitters

Last week's loss to Michigan State snapped a six-game win streak for Nebraska, as well as a 10-game streak of winning games decided by seven points or fewer.

Running back Ameer Abdullah was held to 45 yards and two touchdowns, but moved to within 25 vards of Ahman Green for second on Nebraska's career rushing list.

Sophomore Jordan Westerkamp recorded career highs of nine catches and 158 receiving yards. His nine receptions tied for eighth in Nebraska history and were the most by a Husker since Kenny Bell had nine catches against Minnesota in 2012. Westerkamp's 158 receiving yards tied Maurice Purify (2007 at Kansas) for the fifth-highest total in school history.

Nebraska sophomore quarterback Tommy Armstrong Jr. lost for just the second time as Nebraska's starter, dropping to 12-2 in his career. Both of Armstrong's losses have come against Michigan State. Armstrong Jr. set career highs with 20 completions and 273 passing yards in a losing effort.

Senior receiver Kenny Bell caught three passes before leaving with an injury. Bell has 156 career receptions, 10 shy of the Nebraska career record of 166 by Nate Swift.

Still, do they expect another close game with the Panthers?

"I do, yes," Glenn said. "They have an awfully good team, but we're better than we were a year ago, and gave them a heck of a game.

Northern Iowa (2-3, 0-1) has played two FBS teams this season, so its record doesn't tell the full story. The Panthers have held all three of their FCS opponents to under 100 rushing yards, and have allowed only one passing touchdown in those games.

The biggest weapon for the Panthers is preseason All-American running back David Johnson, who averages 104 yards a game. In last year's meeting with USD, he carried the ball 35 times for 181 yards.

It's last season's outcome that the Coyotes would like to obviously replicate.

"It'll probably be a similar result," Éarl said. "We know we have to play a complete game with them."

Vikings Pledge Another \$500K For New Stadium Project

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) - The Minnesota Vikings have pledged an additional \$500,000 for enhancements to the new \$1 billion stadium, but despite protests by birdlovers, the improvements won't include bird-safe glass.

The Minnesota Sports Facilities Authority agreed Friday the Vikings would pay \$518,000 for another elevator, two mobile concessions stands, and redesigned media and skyway areas, The Star Tribune reported. Most of that money will go toward the elevator - making a total of eight in the building.

About two dozen bird enthusiasts attended Friday's authority meeting, toting signs such as, "It's never too late to do the right thing.

Preservationists argue the glass in the stadium's current design will kill migrating birds who will crash into it. A couple of protesters told the authority to spend an extra \$1 million for bird-safe glass.

But it's not in the plan. Authority Chairwoman Michele Kelm-Helgen said the building was designed with an openair feeling, and the glass on the roof will be fritted to help birds avoid collisions.

not being able to practice," Jacobs said.

Though he wasn't in action for USD's first five games, Jacobs was still a noticeable presence at practices, helping his fellow defensive lineman — next to d-line coach Marquice Williams.

"It's been a while, but being able to watch the guys and spending time with coach Williams has made me a better player," Jacobs said. In what way?

In the sense that even though Jacobs hasn't been going through drills, he's still been in the loop, he said. There were still some early rust to be knocked off in Wednesday's first practice back, but no worry, Jacobs added.

"It took a little bit of time, but honestly, I've been so focused with the guys," he said. "I knew all the plays and what to do.'

And so, he will rejoin a defensive line unit that has recorded one sack on the sea-

son.

The Coyotes have played on the line: Drew Iddings (18 tackles, 1 sack), Sean Bredl

(16 tackles, 1 INT), Fred Beau-

gard (14), Bailey Sutko (8), Adam Praska (4), Kray Krolikowski (3), Jon Maag (2), Mason Ruiz (1) and Matt Miller (1).

As the swelling of Jacobs' spleen has subsided, he has been able to boost his weight back up near 285 pounds, Glenn said.

"Time's a wasting. We need him," the Coyote coach said. "I hope he plays a whale of a game. We really need him

His teammates agreed. "You really can't do anything about it, stuff like that happens, but it's awesome we got him back," sophomore wide receiver Riley Donovan said. "He's a playmaker. We need him.'

Jacobs, who has started 20 games (and played in all 21) over the previous two seasons, might need a little time to rediscover his game speed Saturday, according to Glenn.

"His first game, he might be finding his way," Glenn said. "It's the same thing with our quarterback. It might take a little time to develop a rhythm.'

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
