you're going to leave a couple high after that.'

Northern Iowa's line tandem of sophomore Brett Mc-Makin and senior Mac O'Brien combined for five sacks, six tackles for loss, while McMakin had an interception. Senior Ronelle Mc-Neil and junior Isaac Ales also had a sack.

'The game was won in the trenches, and their front seven was just sensational," Glenn said.

Though South Dakota scored a touchdown from running back Trevor Bouma (17 yards) on the game's first drive, the Panthers eventually took control in the second quarter.

A field goal followed by a 28-yard touchdown pass on consecutive drives gave Northern Iowa a 10-7 lead with 2:37 left in the first half a cushion it would maintain into the halftime break.

It wasn't just the Panthers' offense that sparked the turnaround, it was their defense. South Dakota was held to 67 yards of offense on the five series after the opening-drive touchdown.

The teams traded field goals in the third quarter, as the Panthers carried a 20-10 lead into the fourth quarter.

South Dakota put together a 99-yard drive early in the fourth quarter that resulted in a 25-yard touchdown from Earl to Brandt Van Roekel at the 10:17 mark. The extra point was blocked, but pulled the Coyotes within 20-16.

Northern Iowa, though, built a 27-16 lead with 7:49 to play after a 25-yard touchdown pass from Sawyer Kollmorgen to Daurice Fountain. Earl was intercepted on USD's next drive and the Panthers ran out the clock.

The story from the UNI offense that stood out most was the use of two quarterbacks, Kollmorgen and senior Brion Carnes — who started

We've just got to work on attacking more, forcing more turnovers," Warner said. "We need to work on that."

One of the lone highlights for the Coyotes was sophomore kicker Miles Bergner setting a new program singleseason record for consecutive field goals made (10).

But even that was little consolation for a team that committed eight penalties (for 75 yards) and is faced with a trip to Missouri State next weekend.

'We showed we can play well at times, we just have to get more consistent," Warner said. "We know we can play with anyone we, just have to play with more confidence

and know we're the best team on the field that today."


