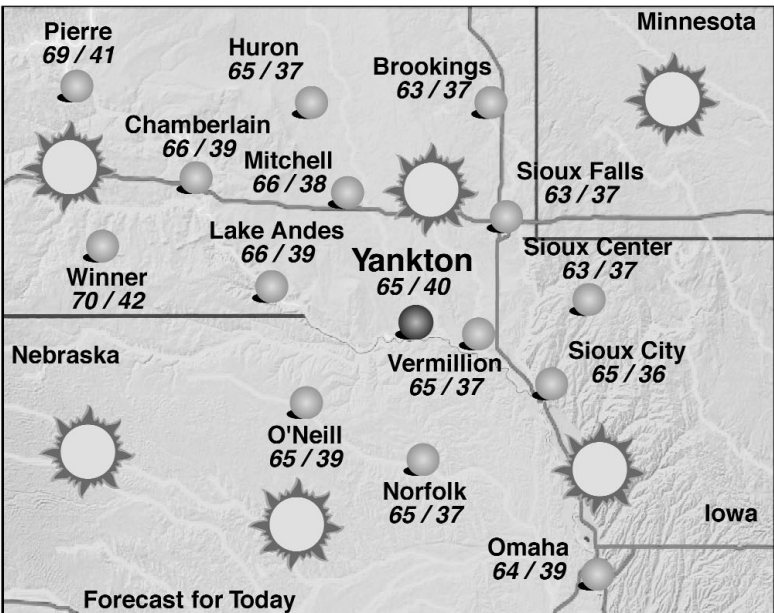

WALL ST. RECAP

The stock market couldn't shake off a case of the jitters from last week and closed sharply lower again on Monday. Airlines, energy and materials stocks were among the biggest decliners. The market is coming off its biggest weekly decline in more than two years. The Standard & Poor's 500 index is 6.8 percent below its September peak.

BOARD OF TRADE


CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for Dec delivery rose 6.75 cents to \$4.0525 a bushel; Dec corn was 12 cents higher at 3.46 a bushel; Dec oats gained 2 cents to \$3.4475 a bushel; while Nov soybeans advanced 22.75

cents to \$9.4525 a bushel. Beef and pork were higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. Dec live cattle rose 1.40 cents to \$1.6670 a pound; Nov feeder cattle was .95 cent higher at \$2.4015 a pound; while Dec lean hogs gained .22 cent to \$9.462 a pound.


