From Page 7 Last week, the offense kicked it up a notch. Though both matches went five sets, the Lancers saw a balanced attack at the net. On Wednesday, sophomore Allison Cross led with 20 kills, while sophomore Sierra Kloth had 16 and junior Bailey Kuchta added 11. Then on Saturday, Kloth led the team with 23 kills, followed by Kuchta (13) and Cross (11). Even that production is a difference from past seasons: Mount Marty has options, according to Groseth. Kloth has a team-high 239 kills this season, followed by Cross (154), Kuchta (108) and Groseth (105) — all keyed by two setters: sophomore Amber Dysthe and Illg.
