Dufrane, Lervick Lead USD At Lesser Harbottle Invite

LAKEWOOD, Wash. — Abby Dufrane shot 15-over-par to finish in a tie for 22nd while Brenna Lervick shot 23-over-par to finish in a tie for 43rd as the South Dakota women's golf team competed at the Pat Lesser Harbottle Invite held at the Tacoma Country and Golf Club on Monday and Tuesday. The tournament was hosted by Seattle University, lasted 54 holes and had 77 competitors from 13 teams.

Dufrane shot a two-over-par 74 in the first round followed by a four-over-par 76 in the second round. She wrapped up the tournament carding a nine-over-par 81. Lervick was seven-over (79) in the first round, four-over (76) in the second and 12-over (84) in the final round.

Outside Dufrane and Lervick, Kaitlyn Krzyzanowski tied for 56th at 27-over-par, Janice Baumberger was 72nd at 44-over-par and Victoria Grasso tied for 73rd at 45-over-par. As a team, the Coyotes finished 11th with a score of 968 (+104).

Washington won the team title by shooting 863 (-1) over the tournament, beating second place Washington State's total of 897 by 34 strokes. Grand Canyon's Charlotte Jaengkit won the individual title at 1-under-par (215), beating Washington's Jing Yan in a 2-3, 4-4, Jake Kopejka 3-5-10, Margaret Castlem 3-10.

The Coyote women will wrap up the fall season by competing at the Creighton Classic starting Oct. 20.
