Dear Editor,

South Dakotans are blessed to have a high quality, affordable health care system with many options for health insurance plans. Why would we want to damage that system by voting for Initiated Measure 17, another government mandate aimed at "fixing" health care? This mandate, written by a small group of doctors who own for-profit specialty hospitals, will benefit ONLY those hospitals — NOT patients. The South Dakota Legislature rejected this idea in 2013; now South Dakotans should do the same.

If you don't, we will all see higher health insurance premiums. Studies show that mandates like Initiated Measure 17 would increase insurance premiums by as much as 20 percent. That's an increase of \$3,200 for a family of four whose premiums already cost, on average, \$16,000 a year. Who can afford that?

Access to health care is a vital part of Avera's commitment to the people of South Dakota. We believe Initiated Measure 17 threatens South Dakotans' health care access because it will take away the choice for an affordable health insurance plan, forcing families to choose the broader provider network with the higher premium.

We encourage South Dakotans to vote NO on Nov. 4 to Initiated Measure 17.
