plays by Groseth to jump out to an early lead in the first set. The Lancers did not allow the Saints to score more than two straight points until back-to-back ace serves by Macy Wollschlager pulled Presentation within one, 20-19. With MMC leading 23-22, Boyle ripped back-to-back kills to give the Lancers the set.

"The other night at Northwestern I was dead the first two sets. In the third set, when we did better, I had some energy," she said. "I was going for that today." MMC spotted the Saints a 7-1 advantage in the third set, then kicked it in gear, outsourcing Presentation 24-7 to end the set and the match. In the final two sets, MMC went to a more conventional 6-2 (two setters who rotate out for hitters when their spots move to the front row), in part because of an injury to middle hitter Allison Cross. "Amber (Dysthe) was not getting over to block their hitters as quickly as we needed her to," Climer said. "We switched to a 6-2, and I thought that worked." The Lancers had switched to a modified 5-1 offense against Morningside, the first match in their recent surge.

While in a traditional 5-1, the same setter stays in all the way through the rotation, MMC rotates Illg and Dysthe depending on where the setter position is in the rotation. "We were looking at something that plays to everyone strengths," Climer said. "It's a nice offense for us." MMC ranks ahead of DWU in the GPAC standings and swept the season series over the Tigers a year ago, but Kloth said that the Lancers cannot overlook their rivals to the north. "We have to come in with the same mentality," she said. "It is a college team, and they can be good if we don't come out ready to play. We have to put all our skills together and play as a team."

Keselowski Keeps Title Hopes Alive At Talladega

TALLADEGA, Ala. (AP) — Coming off a tumultuous week and backed into a must-win situation, Brad Keselowski pulled off one of his biggest victories. Keselowski drove a perfect final two laps in overtime Sunday at Talladega Superspeedway, where he had to win to advance into the third round of NASCAR's championship race. Anything but a victory would have ended his title chances, which took a huge hit last week with a poor finish at Charlotte and a post-race meltdown that earned him a \$50,000 fine. "I know there's probably some people out there that aren't really happy I won," Keselowski said. "I can understand that. But I'm a man like anyone else and not real proud of last week. But I'm real proud of today."

in a three-way race to Victory Lane with six-time and defending champion Jimmie Johnson and Dale Earnhardt Jr., all three needing to win to stave off elimination. It was Keselowski who grabbed the checkered flag. "I'll take the 50 grand and the win this week, wouldn't you?" said Keselowski team owner Roger Penske, who strongly defended his controversial driver. "These guys are jealous of the job he's done this year. He's won six races. He's made poles. He's been up front. Nobody likes to see a guy win like that. "I want him to get mad. I don't want him to take it. We talked about it (last week). I said, 'Brad, put it in the rearview mirror.'"

Penske got both Keselowski and Logano into the third round, but Hendrick had three of its four drivers eliminated Sunday. Only Gordon advanced. "Great teams, great drivers, great friends. I hate to see them not in there," Gordon said about Johnson, Earnhardt and Kahne. "I really thought the chances of two of them getting in were very good, and certainly one of them. I thought two of us would be in there, and I thought there's a decent chance three could be there." Hendrick and Penske drivers combined for 17 wins in the first 26 races, and have duded all season as the top two organizations in NASCAR. "We'll just go and try and win some races before the year is out," Earnhardt said. "That all we've got left."
