Golf: USD Women Win At Creighton

OMAHA, Neb. — Freshman Abby Dufrane took medalist honors at 7-over-par while Brenna Lervick placed fifth at 13-over par as the South Dakota women's golf team won the Creighton Classic held at Oak Hills Country Club on Monday and Tuesday. It's the program's first tournament title since the spring of 2005.

The tournament lasted 36 holes and had six teams and 43 competitors in its field. It was USD's final tournament of the fall season.

Dufrane's score of 151 won the tournament by two strokes over Renee Santoyo of Bellevue. She entered Tuesday's round in second place after shooting two-over 74 on Monday, which was two strokes behind then leader Kathryn Kesti of Omaha. Dufrane shot 5-over 77 on Tuesday to take the win while Kesti shot 10-over 82 to finish third.

Lervick was third entering the final round after shooting 5-over 77 on Monday. She shot 8-over 80 in her final round to finish at 157.

Kaitlyn Krzyzanowski and Kylie Gaughenbaugh tied for 19th at 24-over-168 to round out USD's top scorers. Individually, Hannah Withrow finished in a tie for 17th at 23-over-67 and Janice Baumberger was tied for 26th at 28-over-172.

In the team standings, USD had a score of 642 while Creighton had a score of 646. Bellevue rounded out the top-three at 648.

Before Tuesday, the USD women's team's last tournament win was when it hosted the South Dakota Invitational held on April 4, 2005.

Golf: USD Men Finish Fifth At ODU-Outerbanks Inv.

POWELLS POINT, N.C. — Sam Matthew shot an even 213 to finish fifth individually as the South Dakota men's golf team ended its fall season with a 12th-place finish at the Old Dominion/Outerbanks Invitational held at Kilmarric Golf Course. The tournament, which started on Sunday, was 54 holes long and had 84 competitors from 16 teams.

Matthew shot 1-under-par 70 in the first round and 2-under 69 in the second round to enter the final round in second place. Matthew carded 3-over 74 in his final round.

Cody Seal was USD's second-best finisher at 14-over-par (227), which tied for 50th. Campbell's Gaston Bertinotti won medalist honors at 9-under-par (205).

James Madison won the team title with a three round score of 858. Hartford finished second at 862, Maryland was third at 869, Campbell was fourth at 873 and tournament host Old Dominion rounded out the top-five with a score of 874. USD finished with a score of 904.

Kokesh Second In Preseason Ranking

LINCOLN, Neb. — Nebraska senior Robert Kokesh is one of eight Huskers listed in the Inter-Mat Preseason wrestling poll, announced on Tuesday.

Kokesh, a 174-pounder from Wagner, took fourth place at the 2014 NCAA Championships after a 37-3 campaign as a junior. He finished third at nationals as a sophomore in 2013.

As a team, Nebraska is ranked 10th in the tour-

nament rankings and holds the No. 7 spot in the dual meet rankings.

The Huskers open their 2014-15 campaign on Friday, Oct. 31 by hosting the Coaches Clinic/Intrasquad event at the Devaney Center at 5 p.m. The following day, Green and Kokesh will each grapple at the NWCA All-Star Classic at the Palestra in Philadelphia, Pa. Nebraska's first home dual is slated for Sunday, Nov. 16 against new Big Ten foe Maryland at the NU Coliseum.

USD's Schutt, Hertting Claim Summit League Honors

ELMHURST, Ill. — South Dakota sophomores Sam Schutt and Greysen Hertting have been named the Summit League's Women's Swimmer and Diver of the Week, respectively, for the period ended Oct. 21. The duo captures its second-straight weekly honors of the season.

Schutt records her third career Swimmer of the Week honor after posting four top-three finishes during a two-day meet, including three individual event wins. On Friday, the sophomore won the 200 free in a time of 1:52.83 and the 500 free in 5:02.52 against North Dakota and Northern Colorado. The Columbus, Ohio, native returned the next day to win the 200 free again with a mark of 1:53.24 and finished third in the 100 free with a time of 53.22 seconds. Schutt ranks first in the league in the 200 free and second in the 500 free.

Hertting earns her 12th career Diver of the Week award after recording four top-three finishes, including three individual event wins. The Appleton, Wis., native swept the diving events Saturday at the dual meet against North Dakota and Northern Colorado, winning the one-meter with 242.60

points and the three-meter with 256.55 points. She also won the one-meter with 240.15 points on Friday and took third in the three-meter with 223.80 points.

South Dakota returns to the pool Friday as the team takes on Iowa State at 6 p.m. in Ames, Iowa. The Coyotes will then travel to Cedar Falls, Iowa, Saturday to dual Northern Iowa at 1 p.m.

USD Cross Country Sweeps Summit League Honors

ELMHURST, Ill. — South Dakota juniors Mubarak Musa and Amber Eichhorn swept the Summit League Men's and Women's Cross Country Athlete of the Week honors for the period ended Oct. 19, as released by the Summit League on Tuesday.

Musa earns his second career Athlete of the Week award after finishing in the top-three at the Bradley Pink Classic. Musa crossed the finish line in third, posting a league and career-best 8,000-meter time of 24:42.9. The junior led the Coyotes, ranked No. 15 in the Midwest Region, to a sixth-place finish out of 26 teams. South Dakota finished ahead of three regionally ranked teams in Illinois and Bradley, ranked No. 6 and No. 10 in the Midwest Region, and Summit League foe IUPUI, ranked No. 10 in the Great Lakes Region.

Eichhorn records her second career Athlete of the Week honor following a runner-up finish at the Bradley Pink Classic. Eichhorn's finishing time of 20:45.9 (6k) was a league and career-best, and also the fifth-fastest in meet history. The junior led South Dakota, ranked No. 8 in the Midwest Region, to a second-place finish out of 30 teams. The Coyotes defeated four other regionally-ranked

Midwest teams in No. 4 Missouri, No. 5 Bradley, No. 14 Northern Iowa and No. 15 Loyola (Ill.), and one regionally-ranked team from the Great Lakes in No. 12 Marquette.

"If we clean up the mistakes, we can be decent," he said. "If we're not helping the other team, we can create opportunities."
