COYOTE OFFENSE VS. NDSU DEFENSE

With its top running back, starting right tackle and top tight end out with injury, USD will have its hands full with a Bison defense that allows only 9.7 points a game. Not to mention the fact that the Coyotes haven't scored on the Bison in the last two games. Significant edge to NDSU.

COYOTE DEFENSE VS. NDSU OFFENSE

On the flip side, the Bison average 442 yards of offense and 32.4 points a game, and boast perhaps the best offen sive line in the league (which enables NDSU to lead the nation in time of possession). The Covotes boast just one sack on the season, so getting to QB Carson Wentz will be critical. Edge to NDSU.

SPECIAL TEAMS

If you like watching kickers, today could be your day. NDSU kicker Adam Keller is 13-for-16 on field goals while USD's Miles Bergner is a perfect 12-for-12. The biggest edge, though, resides in kick returns, where USD has struggled to hold back teams, and NDSU boasts a handful of weapons. Edge to the Bison.

INTANGIBLES

Crowd support. It will come as no surprise when NDSU brings a couple thousand fans to the DakotaDome. You might even seen more green and vellow in the stands than red and white. Bison fans know how to get into the game and can cause a lot of havoc for opponents, even on the road. Edge to NDSU.

■ South Dakota State has claimed the last six meetings between the programs, all since the Jackrabbits joined the Missouri Valley Football Conference.

■ Today marks the 101st celebration of "Hobo Day" for SDSU, and the 200th game for SDSU head coach John Stiegelmeier (116-83).

■ This will be the second straight week that Youngstown State will participate in a homecoming game. The Penguins celebrated their own homecoming last week with a 26-14 victory over Southern Illinois.

■ Youngstown State has not won in Brookings since 1974. The series dates back to the 1942 sea-

■ SDSU running back Zach Zenner ranks eighth in FCS history with 5,547 career rushing yards. He needs 184 yards to move into the top five on the career charts. He already holds MVFC records for career rushing and all-purpose (6,973) yards.

■ There will be a ceremonial groundbreaking for Dana J. Dykhouse Stadium at halftime of the game. The new stadium is scheduled to be completed in 2016.

Youngstown State running game vs. SDSU defensive front. The Penguins have pounded opponents on the ground this season, averaging 210.1 yards per contest. SDSU has struggled defending the run, allowing 178.9 yards per game with 15 rushing touchdowns on the season.
