Menno, Parkston, Wagner Get Funding

WASHINGTON - Menno, Parkston And Wagner are receiving funding from the USDA for rural water and wastewater improvements.

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack announced Thursday that USDA is providing more than \$352 million in loans and grants to upgrade rural water and wastewater systems nationwide and make infrastructure improvements in rural Alaska villages. The projects funded will not only help ensure rural places have access to clean water, but will also create jobs and help communities retain and attract new businesses and families.

In South Dakota, the city of Menno is receiving a \$1,036,000 loan to upgrade the sewer sanitary system, the city of Parkston is receiving a \$300,000 loan to extend sanitary sewer collection lines and add additional hook-ups, and the city of Wagner is receiving a loan of \$1,754,000 and a grant of \$200,000 to make upgrades to the water and sanitary sewer system as well as the storm sewer system. The investments re provided through USDA's Rural Utilities Service (RUS), which also administers infrastructure programs that fund broadband and rural electric systems to meet the needs of rural communities.
