In 1995, when the Menno Pioneer Heritage Association was organized, he served as the treasurer until 2013. He was a lifelong member at Zion Reformed

Church. He sang in the church choir and in the community Men's chorus.

Gordon is survived by Pat, his wife of 58 years; four children: Rhonda (Danny) Poole, Renee Mettler (Terry Isaacson) and daughters, Taryn and Hanna, David (Patty) Mettler and son, Lucas, and Tricia Mettler (Kevin Gray) and children, Zane and Kai; his brother, Ray Mettler; sister-in-law, Carol Mettler, and brothers-in-law, Clifford Handel and Forrest (Barb) Conrad.
