Do Any Of Us Really Care?

Let me ask you in the Christian community, what might be an impertinent question, do we really care??? Dumb question! Maybe. But let me tell you why I ask. I have served on a few non-profit boards around this community that seek to address one need or another among populations in our community, and when I ask the question about support from the churches or the Christian community,

what I see are mostly blank stares. Maybe it is because these organizations have never thought about asking churches, after all the default place to solicit funding is government agencies (the federal government, the state, the county or the city) and the United Way. But being clergy I cannot help but wonder why is the church population so under represented on the list of givers to these social service" groups.

Now one possibility is that our churches all have wonderful programs in place to help the abused, homeless, the hungry, or whatever the need may be. (I chose those three as they are the ones I am most familiar with, and I know there are incredible needs just among the agencies represented by the United Way) Maybe our churches are doing so much work to alleviate the basic issues in these areas that we are tapped out and have no extra funding to support others in this

Maybe, but in the years I have served this community and others like this, I have yet to see this in practice.

Back to my question, do we care? Nearly 25 years ago I was in a courtroom, when at the conclusion of what was a juvenile proceeding the judge "invited" me to his chambers. I don't know if you have ever received that invite. but it is one you don't turn down. In his chambers,

he looked at me and said, "I want you and the church community to do something about teaching parenting or I will see third generation in my courtroom.'

Unfortunately I was not able to do something about that issue in that community, but it is behind the reason there is a counseling center located in the church I currently serve, because a judge cared enough to challenge me to do something more than preach on Sunday and lead a good Bible study. So back to my question, do we care? Now let me stop whining and start

meddling! This is November the season when we start thinking about family gatherings and eating turkey. Do you know what our social service agencies are thinking about? Where will they get enough food to

feed the hungry through the winter. Where will they find a bed for the family who has been evicted from their apartment or home, or just passing through when their car broke down.

Or how can we assist the abused and broken over the holidays when things seem to worse? What can we do as the churches of Yankton. Let me suggest something by way of an old story.

Some people were gathered to pray for a family who were going through a time of difficulty in their finances. In other

words, they were broke, out of work, and the prospects were slim.

As one man was praying fervently there was a knock at the door. They stopped, opened the door and there was

The man said, "What do you want,

The boy replied, "Pa couldn't come, so I brought his prayers in the pickup. Just come and help me, please, and we'll bring them in.'

Pa's "prayers" consisted of meat, potatoes, flour, beef, vegetables, apples and jellies. The prayer meeting broke up pretty quickly after that.

Maybe this November instead of just praying for the members of our community who need a little more assistance, maybe, just maybe we should put our prayers into our pickups or our checks sent to these agencies.

Then maybe, just maybe the folks who need help the most will know that we do really care. But then again what is a cup of cold water in Jesus name anyway, maybe that is a bed, or a safe place to be, or maybe groceries to get them till the next pay day or the next installment on their EBT card. But then again what do I know, I am

just a preacher, but then I think of that judge....Maybe the day is coming when I will stand in front of another judge who will ask me what I did for the "least of these" whom I did not do much for.

I hope that I can tell him that I did not iust stand by and offer a prayer, but I loaded my prayers into the "pickup" and let others know that I care.

Maybe just maybe we can say we do care. I hope so.

Israeli Citizen To Talk About Peace At Freeman Community Center

FREEMAN — Dr. Jeff Halper who is an Israeli citizen, will speak at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 4, in the Freeman Community Center.

Halper is co-founder and Director of the Israeli Committee Against House Demolitions (IČAHD), a non-violent Israeli peace and human rights organization dedicated to ending the Israeli occupation and achieving a just peace between Israelis

and Palestinians.

Born in the U.S., Halper emigrated to Israel in 1973. He is an anthropology professor and has taught at universities both in Israel and abroad. He has authored several books the latest being "An Israeli in Palestine" In 1997, he co-founded

ICAHD, a grassroots political and human rights organization which uses Israel's policy of demolishing Palestinian homes (25,000 in the occupied

territories since 1967) as a vehicle for resisting the Occupa-

In 2006, Halper was nominated by the American Friends Service Committee for the Nobel Peace Prize.

In August 2008, he participated in the sailing of the first boats of the Free Gaza Movement into Gaza to break the Israeli and international siege.

His topic in Freeman will be "No Home, No Homeland: Israel's Policy of Demolishing Palestinian Homes."

He will also be speaking in Sioux Falls at the Spirit of Peace Church on Wednesday, Nov. 5, on the topic "An Israeli in Palestine: Resisting Occupation, Forging Peace with Justice, Fostering Human Rights.

There is no charge for this event, but an opportunity to donate to his organization will be provided.
