The Market Street Incubator Is Back

VERMILLION – The Vermillion Area Chamber and Development VDCD has announced that Sencio Systems will be moving into the Market Street Office Building in Downtown Vermillion this October. This is the office that the VDCD has called home for more than five years.

The VDCD and Welcome Center will temporarily move out to the newly constructed Vermillion Technology Center at 1012 Princeton.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks rose across the board Wednesday following big gains in Asia and Europe, a buoyant end to the worst quarter for the market in four years. Energy companies and raw material suppliers, the biggest losers in the quarter, rose more than 2 percent each.

ON WEDNESDAY:

The Dow Jones industrial average gained 235.57 points, or 1.5 percent, to 16,284.70. The Standard & Poor's 500 index jumped 35.94 points, or 1.9 percent, to 1,920.03. The Nasdaq composite climbed 102.84 points, or 2.3 percent, to 4,620.16.

FOR THE WEEK:

The Dow is down 29.97 points, or 0.2 percent. The S&P 500 index is down 11.31 points, or 0.6 percent. The Nasdaq is down 66.33 points, or 1.4 percent.

FOR THE YEAR:

The Dow is down 1,538.37 points, or 8.6 percent. The S&P 500 index is down 138.87 points, or 6.7 percent. The Nasdaq is down 115.89 points, or 2.5 percent.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly higher Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery gained 9 cents to \$5.1275 a bushel; December corn fell 1.25 cents to 3.8775 a bushel; December oats were up .25 cent to 2.2675 a bushel; while November soybeans advanced 7.75 cents to \$8.92 a bushel.

Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was off 3.23 cents to \$1.3092 a pound; November feeder cattle fell 4.35 cents to \$1.7260 a pound; while December lean hogs lost .33 cent to \$.6672 a pound.
