The residents and staff of the 74-bed Avera Yankton Care Center, located at 1212 West Eighth Street, will be moved into two new neighborhoods currently under construction at the Avera Sister James Care Center on the Avera Majestic Bluffs campus. Future clinics are planned for the first and third Monday of every month. The date of the next clinic is Oct. 19.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mixed Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for December delivery rose 5.50 cents to \$5.1825 a bushel; December corn was up 1 cent to 3.8875 a bushel; December oats were fell 5.75 cents to 2.21 a bushel; while November soybeans declined 14.75 cents to \$8.7725 a bushel.

Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was off .92 cent to \$1.30 a pound; November feeder cattle fell .48 cent to \$1.7212 a pound; while December lean hogs lost 2.20 cents to \$.6452 a pound.

Yankton's annual Fall Festival, sponsored by the retail merchants division of the Chamber of Commerce, radio station WNAX, and the House of Gurney Inc. opened at 9 a.m. this morning with several hundred outside people in the city to initiate the 1940 "Pancake" line.

25 YEARS AGO

Tuesday, October 2, 1990

An attempt to organize a union at the Human Services Center of Yankton is still underway, and the facility's administrator says efforts will intensify as the Nov. 6 general election nears.

Henry Smith has brought a great deal of wealth from New York City to Yankton, but not in the monetary sense. Smith, a performer, choreographer, director, video maker and teacher, has been sharing his talents with all grades from the Yankton school system since Sept. 13, and he will continue his instruction until Oct. 5.

50 YEARS AGO

Saturday, October 2, 1965

A fire that may have started from an explosion in a drier on a rear porch completely burned out the north half of the farm home of Mr. and Mrs. Leo Hauger and their five children Friday afternoon, and extensive damage was done from smoke in most of the rest of the house.
