Bucks Look To Ride Momentum Into State State Golf: Parkston, Vermillion

Look To Contend In Class A

A runner-up finish in the Eastern South Dakota Conference Boys' Golf Championship has the Yankton Bucks thinking big this weekend.

The Bucks head west for the South Dakota State Class AA Boys' Golf Tournament, which begins on Monday at Meadowbrook Golf Course in Rapid City.

"It was a welcome surprise," said Yankton head coach Brett Sime of the finish. We played there two weeks ago, and we were the fifth of nine ESD teams that day. The kids went out and played well in a big tournament.

The Bucks opened the season having to replace two golfers who are now playing collegiately, but have pushed each other throughout the season. Senior Mason Sundleaf, now the team leader after being one of the younger varsity players for several years, said the leadership qualities he learned over the years have helped him step into that role.

"What I learned from them is this: you can't let a bad shot, or even a bad round, get in your head," he said. "I tried to do the same things for our young guys this year that they (the 2015 gradu-ates) did for me last year."

Besides Sundleaf, the Bucks will take Michael Frick, Mat Jensen, A.J. Fernandez, Jimmie Cunningham and Dalton Maibaum to Rapid City. The tournament, though, will have a different feel due to a new pairings format. Teams were grouped based on season averages, with golfers from one school playing with the same schools in each of the six groups.

Tuesday's groupings will be similar, but based on firstround scores.

"They are sending the teams out together," Sime said. "All six guys will be next to each other. We're in the third wave, playing with Roosevelt and Mitchell (on Monday)."

While the Bucks have not played Meadowbrook this season, they have a taste of that course in the two home courses they frequent.

"It's a little different course, but it's a little bit like Hillcrest, a little bit like Fox

Run," Sime said. "The key will be keeping the ball in play. Like Hillcrest, if you're in the trees it's going to be a long

day. "The greens at Meadowbrook are like Fox Run, a little bigger.'

The Bucks' recent success and continued progress have them excited for state.

"As a team, our goal is always to place," Sundleaf said. "We have the potential to do it. Now we just need ev-eryone to have a good couple of days.

The tournament concludes on Tuesday.

Class A

The Parkston Trojans and Vermillion Tanagers will look to compete for team honors in the Class A Tournament, set for Monday and Tuesday at Pine Hills Golf Course in Milbank. Golfers from Dakota Valley, Elk Point-Jefferson and Beresford will also compete in the event.

Vermillion finished second behind Dakota XII Conference rival Dell Rapids a season ago, but the Tanagers return just two of those golfers: Cooper Williams, who tied for third, and Paul Schwasinger, who tied for 46th.

Schwasinger was the Tanagers top golfer in the Region 3A Tournament, where Vermillion snuck into state despite finishing fourth as a team. Williams, Sam Craig, Cole Anderson and Ryne Whisler each finished in the top 27, the cut line for the individual tournament.

Parkston, third a season ago, looks to move up the ladder after an easy victory in the Region 3A championship. The Trojans boast five golfers in the first six groups of the tournament.

"We had a nice region

tournament. One through five all played well," said Parkston head coach Tyler Hockett. "Our fifth golfer shot his personal best with an 82.

The Trojans return their top placer a season ago, Jacob Lee (tied for ninth), as well as Garret Hohn (tied for 14th) and Alex Scott (tied for 76th). Jamie Smith and Nate Hohn filled out this season's roster.

Hockett said that Pine Hills represents a challenge
