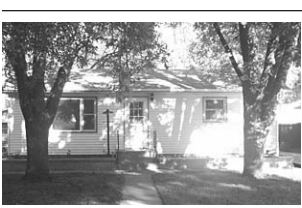

Menace," arrived in 1999, Jimmy Mac felt a familiar tug. "New fathers worry, and my wife was pregnant with my first son when 'Phantom Menace' came out," he said. "I worried that opening day the movie screen would say '20th Century Fox,' John Williams' music would start and my pager would go off: 'Get to the hospital.'"

"But it worked out: Michael came four days later."

There is a passage in "Why Grow Up? Subversive Thoughts for an Infantile Age" — a slim, provocative book from philosopher Susan Neiman — that stopped me cold: "We learn very early that more is possible than is actual." Also: "Being grown up is widely considered to be a matter of renouncing your hopes and dreams, accepting the limits of the reality you are given." And this: "Nostalgia isn't helpful, though it would be stupid to deny we have lost a part of the world we should have tried harder to keep."

So, feel free to wallow in "Star Wars"?

Long into retirement? I spoke with Neiman on the phone from her home in Berlin. She was not a fan of "Star Wars" or action films in general: "I have an old-fashioned view that we get better the more we interact with serious culture seriously, by seeing and reading difficult works." But then she added: "On the other hand, if 'Star Wars' is a comfort, a moral template or fond connection to one's past, I see nothing wrong with sticking with it long into adulthood — as long as it's not the only thing."

Often, despite the stereotype of the blinkered fan, it doesn't seem to be.

I visited the Mokena, Ill., home of Phyllis Schulte, a longtime member of various "Star Wars" groups (and a kind of unofficial seamstress for the 501st's "Midwest Garrison"). At 63, she is a lesson in how to grow old gracefully inside the "Star Wars" bubble. Surrounded by "Star Wars" commemorative plates, flanked by an R2-D2 fish tank, she said: "I feel ancient when I am with these (groups) now, not as relevant. I really hate being old! But it doesn't stop me — the last thing you want is to get old and stop surprising yourself." As a teenager she raced GTOs; as an adult, to create 501st costumes, she taught herself leather-work and how to sew. In her free time she volunteers on controlled field burns for the Forest Preserve District of Will County.

That Bolingbrook garage of Chi2-D2's Matlock was full of his hockey gear; Tricia Barr, the Florida engineer, has competed in equestrian for years. Walking the Celebration floor at the Anaheim Convention Center in the spring, I couldn't help but notice the families towing light sabers and fathers in plastic Boba Fett armor, wearing "Star Wars" lightly, like a Cubs fan with a partial season-ticket package. The vibe was jocular, the crowd heavy on strollers and grandparents. Walking the hall with Mac and Swank was like walking alongside stewards, not missionaries, and a kind of warmth radiated. "Big fan of RebelForce," a passing man said, his son gazing up through adult legs as if from a forest floor. "Thanks," Mac said. He waved and slowed every few feet as fan after fan, young and old, spotted the podcasters. A young girl with braces and glasses, a casting director's idea of a nerd, tapped him on the arm.

"Jimmy, uh, how are you, Jimmy? I've been listening to you guys since grade school," she said, nervous.

Mac and Swank stopped and thanked her, asked her about school, what she's studying, how the convention has been going. A pair of older men from Milwaukee passed and, as though in a crowded bar, shouted "Jimmy!" And Mac yelled: "Cheeseheads!" The men asked if Lucas' planned museum in Chicago would happen, and Mac blew out a stream of air and said he hoped so; he's floated his name to Lucasfilm for a role in the place. Then Mac and Swank veered into the narrow aisles of artists peddling dioramas, parody posters, character sketches. A very large young man asked Mac if he saw the new "Force Awakens" trailer and Mac nodded and the guy said: "Greatest trailer moment ever. This'll sound terrible, Jimmy, but it's a 9/11 thing to me: It was so insane, I will always know where I was when I saw it." Mac and Swank grimaced at the comparison, the lack of perspective.

Swank broke off and called his family.

His wife appeared on Skype and held up their young daughter. Swank gushed out giggly talk and called over to Mac, who bent down and waved and made a silly face in the phone and looked happy. Later Swank told me that he's trying to get his daughter into "Star Wars," and she's been resisting. It's just not taking. "But as Yoda said, 'There is another.' I have a son, and that boy is my only hope."
