Long-Term Care Educational Sessions Scheduled Across The State This Fall

PIERRE — The South Dakota Department of Social Services is hosting several educational sessions in the coming months on long-term care and the Long-Term Care Partnership Program. Sessions will include basic information on long-term care, the related costs, how to plan for long-term care needs, what Medicare and Medicaid will cover and how the Long-Term Care Partnership Program can help. The hour-long educational sessions are open to the public. The session schedule can be found at <https://ltcpartnership.sd.gov/educationsessions.aspx/>. “A long-term care insurance plan certified by the Long-Term Care Partnership Program benefits people with long-term care needs, their families, long term care providers and the state’s Medicaid program,” said Lynne Valenti, Cabinet Secretary of the South Dakota Department of Social Services. “I strongly encourage South Dakotans to attend one of the sessions to learn more about the options available to themselves and their family members.” The Long-Term Care Partnership Program is a public-private partnership that offers individuals quality, affordable long-term care insurance without depleting their assets. The South Dakota Department of Social Services began offering educational sessions on the program in 2007 to raise awareness about long-term care insurance and the benefits for South Dakotans. The board has been working on several project improvements throughout the district such as the Crane-Youngworth/Williams Field project and the Comprehensive Facilities Study. This meeting will provide insight on how the district is implementing those projects and others over the next few years. The public is invited to attend to hear what updates are in store for the plan and how the district can continue the success of the planning process.

Orders for this month's SHARE (Self Help And Resource Exchange) program are due by Friday, Oct. 9. SHARE is a non-profit organization that builds and strengthens the community through volunteer service and by helping people save money on food. Yankton SHARE operates out of Peace Church, 206 E. 31st St. Orders for November may be placed there on Distribution Day. This month, Distribution Day is on Saturday, Oct. 24, from 10-11 a.m. SHARE volunteers distribute the current month's options to various convenience stores, restaurants, churches, apartments, laundromats, and more throughout the Yankton area. Orders can be made by calling one of the volunteers on the sheet: Trinity Clark, 760-5857, or Deb Johnson, 760-3056. Many packages are offered through SHARE. You can order only one package or as many as you wish. “Our orders range from \$13.50 (the minimum) to over \$150 from the individuals who order each month,” Outreach Coordinator Veronica Trezona commented. “There is something for everyone, from fried chicken to fresh fruits and vegetables to yummy desserts.”

Fire Hydrants To Be Flushed In Yankton

The City of Yankton Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants for a one-week period from Oct. 12-16. Flushing will begin at the west edge of the city and move to the east. Water users should use care during this time as there may be some temporary discoloration of the water.

Highway 50 Construction To Begin

The South Dakota Department of Transportation says work will begin on the reconstruction of Highway 50 (4th Street) in Yankton on Monday, Oct. 12. Work being done this year includes removal and replacement of a portion of Burleigh Street south of Highway 50 in order to place the new storm sewer pipe and installation of temporary traffic signals at the intersection of 2nd Street & Broadway. The signals are necessary for the truck detour that will be in place on 2nd Street during the remainder of the 4th Street construction next spring and summer. Motorists are advised Burleigh Street south of 4th Street and the outside lane of Highway 50 from just west of Burleigh Street to Marne Creek will be closed during this year's construction. There will be daylight lane closures on 2nd Street and Broadway Avenue during placement of the temporary traffic signals. D & G Concrete from Sioux Falls is the prime contractor on the \$5.5 million contract.
