

The South Dakota Department of Transportation says work will begin on the reconstruction of Highway 50 (4th Street) in Yankton on Monday, Oct. 12.

Work being done this year includes removal and replacement of a portion of Burleigh Street south of Highway 50 in order to place the new storm sewer pipe and installation of temporary traffic signals at the intersection of 2nd Street & Broadway. The signals are necessary for the truck detour that will be in place on 2nd Street during the remainder of the 4th Street construction next spring and

Motorists are advised Burleigh Street south of 4th Street and the outside lane of Highway 50 from just west of Burleigh Street to Marne Creek will be closed during this year's construction.

There will be daylight lane closures on 2nd Street and Broadway Avenue during placement of the temporary traffic signals.
