"QPRT: Suicide Risk Assessment and Risk Management Training" will be Nov. 18 from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. at the Human Services Center South Training Center in Yankton.

QPRT stands for "Questions, Persuade, Refer and Treat." The QPRT suicide risk management inventory was developed to help professionals who assist, evaluate, counsel or treat people at risk of suicide to better assess and assist those people at elevated risk for suicidal behaviors.

QPRT is a risk detection, risk assessment and risk management tool designed to gather critical, standardized information about a person's status in an intake, screening or interview setting, while also establishing a safety/intervention plan for those determined to be at risk of suicide.
