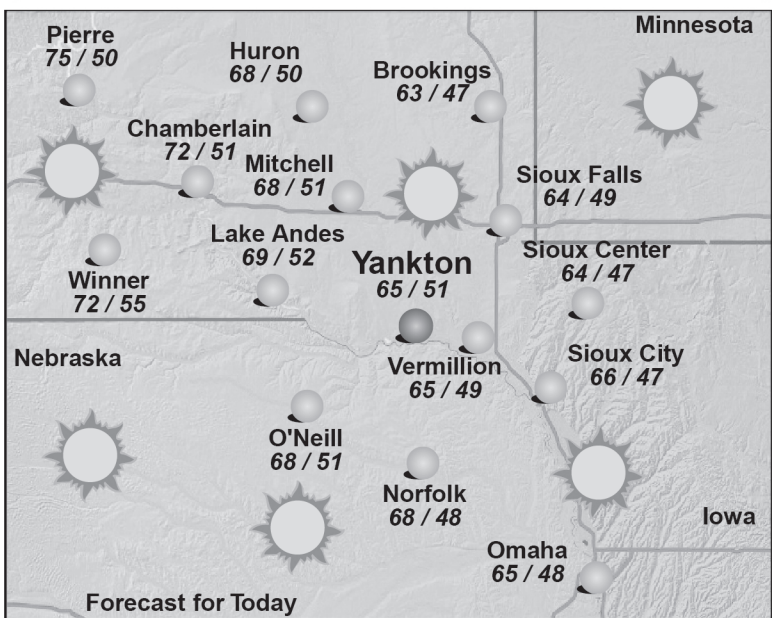

Signs that the Federal Reserve would keep interest rates low for several more months pushed stocks broadly higher on Thursday, adding to what has been a near eight-day rally. Energy stocks advanced with the price of oil.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 138.46 points, or 0.8 percent, to close at 17,050.75. The Standard & Poor's 500 index added 17.60 points, or 0.9 percent, to 2,013.43. The Nasdaq composite rose 19.64 points, or 0.4 percent, to 4,810.79.
