USD ON OFFENSE

MATCHUPS

For the Coyotes, it's simple: They need to develop some momentum. After hanging 52 points on Drake, USD managed three points last week and turned the ball over three times. Expect to see a steady dose of Trevor Bouma, as USD looks to right the offensive ship. Slight edge to USD.

USD ON DEFENSE

The defense has been one of the bright spots this season for the Coyotes. The switch to a 4-man front has created pressure, which has allowed the secondary to play loose. USD has traditionally struggled against the run in conference play, and WIU boasts a 250-pound running back. Slight edge to WIU.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Western Illinois boasts one of the top all-purpose weapons (Lance Lenoir) in the nation, as he averages 153 all-purpose yards a game. Meanwhile, USD has an emerging weapon in Paul Anderson, but he's still learning (he fumble a punt on the 2-yard line last week). We'll give the edge to WIU.

INTANGIBLES

Momentum. It's something Western Illinois has right now and something USD is looking to rediscover. The Leathernecks played top-ranked Coastal Carolina tight and then beat Southern Illinois. The Covotes who have struggled on the road in league play, struggled on offense last week. Edge to WIU.

■ In last year's meeting, SDSU's Zach Zenner (now Detroit Lions) and Jake Wieneke each scored touchdowns of 90-plus yards in the second half to rally the Jackrabbits to victory. Wieneke had a 91-yard catch, tying the longest in program history, and Zenner had a 94-yard run.

■ Eight different players scored for Indiana State in their 56-28 rout of Missouri State last week. So far this season, 10 different receivers have at least one catch, nine different players have at least one carry, and four dif-ferent players have attempted a pass, including wide receiver Gary Owens.

■ The Sycamores are now 3-1 for the second-straight season -- the first time that has happened back-to-back

since 1994-95.

■ SDSU senior linebacker T.J. Lally ranks third among all active Football Championship Subdivision players in career tackles, heading into play Saturday.

■ Active duty and former military personnel can receive two free tickets to South Dakota State's football game against Indiana State Saturday night. Tickets can be claimed at Gate 7,

which is located on the west side of Coughlin-Alumni Stadium, by presenting a valid military ID. Gates open at 4:30 p.m., with kickoff slated for 6 p.m. Additional tickets can be purchased at JackrabbitTickets.com or at the stadium ticket booth.

Everything the Coyotes have done to this point on defense, particularly against the run, will be tested against Watson. Having held Youngstown State – which torched USD for 309 yards a year ago - to 143 yards on the ground last week should, at least, instill some confidence for what's ahead for the Coyotes.

"The Missouri Valley is no joke," Graham said. "Experience comes in handy a lot. "You've got big running

backs; you have to know how to bring those guys down. You can't just expect to come in and bring them down with

a simple shoulder." Especially against a bruiser like Watson. "They run him straight

ahead, and even if you don't get a clean hold, he'll push the pile," Glenn said. "That's concerning." What hasn't been a

concern, unlike previous seasons, has been having defenders out on the field who have gone through a season or two in the Missouri Valley Football Conference.
