YSB Plans Big Results Monday

During its monthly school board meeting Monday, the Yankton School Board is set to announce the firm that will conduct the district's comprehensive facilities study.

Last week, the board held a special meeting to hear presentations from the three final design firms. Members of the board have since been studying the plans and will choose between DLR Group (Omaha, Nebraska), Koch Hazard Architects (Sioux Falls) and TSP Inc. (Sioux Falls).

A presentation highlighting the results of the community online survey concerning the Crane Youngworth/Williams Field Project will be part of the meeting as well.

Also on the agenda for Monday, Wade Pogony, Executive Director of Associated School Boards of South Dakota (ASBSD) will present the board with a \$1,000 check. YSB was awarded the 2015 School Board of Excellence Award last August. This check is part of the award and can be used at the discretion of the school board.

The YSB will additionally consider its partnership with Lewis and Clark Behavioral Health Services to obtain grant funding for an Intensive Family Service Pilot Program.

Plus, Director of Student Services/SPED Kathy Wagner will provide an overview of the Smarter Balanced Testing results for the district.

The meeting starts at 5:30 p.m. and will be held at the district administration building located at 2410 West City Limits Road.


DRIVERS EXAM SCHEDULE

<b>Driver Exam Station Schedule</b>	<b>NOTE:</b> A driver license with a gold star in the upper right-hand corner also qualifies as a federally compliant card for identification.
Here is the monthly schedule for area driver's license examinations in the area. File application at least one hour in advance of scheduled closing hours if you wish to complete examination on the same day. For more information, call (800) 952-3696 or visit www.state.sd.us/dps/dl	If your name is different than the name on your identity document, you will need to bring additional proof of your legal name. Acceptable documents for proof of legal name change are a certified marriage certificate (issued by a state vital records agency), a certified adoption document, or a certified court order authorizing a name change (such as a divorce decree). If you have had multiple marriages, you will need to bring similar documents providing legal proof of each name change. The examiners must be able to trace from your birth name to your current name.
• Armour — 9 a.m.-3:30 p.m., second and third Thursday, Courthouse, 706 Braddock.	• ONE document to prove your Social Security number: Social Security card, W-2 Form, SSA 1099 Form, Non-SSA 1099 Form, pay stub (must include name and Social Security number). The regulations do not allow personnel to accept any other document as proof of Social Security number.
• Center/Knox Co. (Neb.) — 8:30-4 p.m. every Friday (closed noon-1 p.m.).	• TWO documents to prove your residential address. A parent's proof of address is acceptable for a minor child. Bring two of the documents listed here (each must contain your current address): Utility bill, credit card statement, pay stub or earnings statement, rent receipt, phone bill, transcript or report card from accredited school, bank statement, mortgage document, tax document, homeowners/renter's insurance policy. Other items will be reviewed by licensing personnel. PO Box addresses are acceptable in areas not assigned street or 911 addresses. VERMILLION – The Clay County Democratic Party will be hosting a watch party for the first of six Democratic debates on Oct. 13 beginning at 7:30 p.m. The watch party will be held at Howlers (912 N Dakota Street) and is open to voters or interested individuals of all political parties. The event will be broadcast live from CNN with Anderson Cooper moderating.

As of Oct. 1, the confirmed candidates include Martin O'Malley, Lincoln Chaffee, Hilary Clinton, Bernie Sanders and Jim Webb. Vice-President Joe Biden may also be in attendance should he declare his candidacy before the debate.

The Clay County Democrats emphasize the open nature of this watch party. "Political affiliation aside, we encourage all interested voters to join us on Oct. 13," Vice-Chair Doug Kronaizl said, "and we hope this event serves partly as a chance for voters to hear what the Democratic candidates are saying, but also as an opportunity to discuss how these candidates and their stances might impact our lives here in Clay County."

The group plans to host similar events and open discussions for future debates.
