Grants Available To 4-H Clubs And FFA/FCCLA

PIERRE — The South Dakota Department of Agriculture announces that grant funding is now available through the Building Our South Dakota Rural Communities (BOSDRC) grant program.

Grants are open to 4-H clubs, FFA chapters, and Family Career and Community Leaders (FCCLA) of America chapters. The grants are designed to demonstrate the importance of communities and organizations working together to improve rural life.

Two types of grants are available. The basic grant is used for community improvement projects and is limited to \$750 per project. The safety grant is used for projects that enhance public safety and is limited to \$200 per project.

"We have seen a lot of great projects over the years," says Terri LaBrie, fi-

nance administrator with the department. "Some examples of what the grant may be used for include constructing flower beds for the community or a building a wheel chair ramp for a business as well as older students putting on a farm safety class for younger students."

Applications must be submitted or postmarked no later than Oct. 31, 2015. All applications must be submitted on the approved forms for Fiscal Year 2016. Grant application forms and more information on the program, including reporting requirement, are available at <http://sdda.sd.gov> under the Agricultural Development tab and click on Finance Programs.

Car Talk

No Need To Turn Off Accessories Before Cranking The Engine

Dear Car Talk:
Is it harmful to start the car if the air conditioner, radio, etc., have been left in the "on" position?

—Stanley

Yes, that's why at the shop, we recommend to all of our customers that they leave their cars idling from May through September.

Actually, no. It's not harmful at all, Stanley. For two reasons.

First, cars automatically shut off auxiliary power while the car is cranking. So when you turn the key to crank the engine and start the car, the AC, the radio and virtually every other electrical device is shut off anyway. That al-

lows the maximum amount of current to be directed from the battery to the starter motor, where it's needed.

Once the car starts, power is restored to the accessories, and they pick up wherever they left off.

The second reason it's not a problem is because it doesn't matter when you turn them on — you're still turning them on. They're designed to be turned on suddenly, whether it's when you start the car, or when you flip their on-off switch.

So don't worry. None of these devices need to be gently shaken awake in the morning, like I do.
