"We're anticipating a lot of cars. It will be interesting. These people will be wanting to get back home, for sure, Natrona County Fire Marshall Bob Fawcett said.

The fire began at a composting area of the Casper Regional Landfill on Saturday and continued to menace an ever-wider expanse of prairie Tuesday, Afternoon winds that kept driving the flames beyond firefighters' reach were forecast to continue.

The Red Cross asked Casper residents to donate yard implements — shovels, rakes, leather gloves — to aid the task of sifting through debris for any personal belong-

A blizzard wouldn't be unusual anywhere in Wyoming this time of year but this fall has been more like July, with recent highs in the low 80s.

We haven't had much moisture across the state since, really, the beginning of September. Just these hot, dry days — fairly high temperatures and low relative humid-Wyoming State Forester Bill Crapser said Tuesday. Elsewhere over the past

few days: - A fire burned about 4.5 square miles of the Standing Rock Indian Reservation in

While the corrections department takes care of local third graders, Yankton's Sertoma Club provides pumpkins for pre-kindergarten through second grade.

The club has been giving away pumpkins for more than 45 years. Sertoma used to take care of pre-kindergarten through fourth graders until the DOC stepped in to help with the heavy load.

This year was a bumper crop for the club. Members harvested more than 1,000 pumpkins.

'The biggest problem this year is that we had so much moisture, the pumpkins were huge," said longtime Sertoma member Jim Robinson. "The little kids always want to take the biggest one there. But then they can't carry it, so you see (the kids) rolling them home.'

'We always try to start with the older kids because then we can get rid of the big ones," said P.R. Olson, Sertoma member and head of the project. "I don't like loading small ones. I want the big ones. But for little kids, you need the small ones.

The club has a patch in Nebraska and plants pumpkins every spring as a source for school kids. Sertoma has several volunteers involved in planting, harvest and

delivering the crop. "The kids line up and wait their turn," Robinson said. "We just haul out the pumpkins and away they go.'

The delivery began Tuesday morning at Beadle Elementary School and continued to Webster, Lincoln and Stewart schools.

The best part? The students get to choose their own pumpkins. The front yards of the buildings are lined with enough for each student. Then, the search is on for the brightest, and most of the time, biggest looking prize.

"The thing that is fun to watch is the little ones," said Lincoln Elementary School principal Paul Struck. "Sometimes their eyes are much bigger than their arms."

After their selection process, each teacher decides what the kids will do with their newly acquired pickings - the most popular being math experiments.

"Some of the teachers turn it into more than just a pumpkin, but a learning

experience," Struck said. Students measure the base of the fruit while calculating and comparing the circumference, diameter and radius. The younger students make it more of an art project by diving right into the insides. Some teachers use those seeds to make toasted fall snacks. Kindergarteners use construction paper to build a Halloween face fit for a "pump-king."

Other teachers let the kids take their pumpkins home to do holiday projects with their families.

"I remember when I was a kid, if you got a pumpkin, that was great," said one of the volunteer inmates. "The best part is just seeing the smiles on the kids' faces and knowing we did something, despite our situation, to affect someone positively on the outside."

Not only do kids receive the special treat, but the DOC also donates its pumpkins for local decorating at the Yankton's fire stations, city hall and the Senior Center.

The department is also incorporating a new project next spring, when it will be partnering with the Yankton ommunity Seed Library.

The inmates will be growing certain vegetables to maturity such as tomatoes, beans, squash, bell peppers, etc. This produce will then be delivered to the Federal Prison Camp where members will take the seeds out, dry them properly and package them.

Starting next spring, the library will host gardening classes and offer those free seeds to people attending the classes.

Both groups plan on continuing this October tradition to make sure every pumpkin rolls away with a child closely behind it.
