VERMILLION – Audrey Reeg had a big night for South Dakota, with 19 kills and 17 digs, as the Covotes defeated IUPUI 25-21, 21-25, 25- 22, 25-16 in Summit League volleyball action Friday in the Coyote Den inside the Dakota Dome.

"It was huge, out of a loss on Tuesday we were really disappointed in," USD coach Leanne Williamson said. "Audrey Reeg has been pretty steady for us, averaging almost five kills a set, and still almost hitting .300." USD bounced back from a

bad loss to South Dakota State on Tuesday.

"I think that we came out today and we played our game and kind of make IUPUI play our style of volleyball a little bit more," Williamson said. "It's a big turnaround, it's almost a complete 180 from Tuesday, and that shows a lot about what our team is."

For USD, Brittany Jessen led the game with 58 assists, and Kelsey Biltoft led with five total blocks.

For IUPUI, Kaitlyn Hickey tied Reeg with a game-high 19 kills. Courtney Halter was the leader with 22 digs. Alexis Mapes and Ashley Hacker led the team with 29 and 25 assists, respectively.

The Coyotes came out hot in the first set, starting out with a 5-0 lead that they would not give up. IUPUI would tie the set at 20, but following a timeout, USD would put four straight points on the board with Haley Jorgensen finishing of the set with a kill. Reeg had seven kills in the set, including two in a row after the 20-20 tie. IUPUI would duplicate what USD did in the second set, only trailing in the set at 2-1. The Jaguars' Hickey recorded eight kills in the set.

A comeback was needed for the Coyotes to win the third. USD called a timeout down 19-14 and immediately got two blocks from Biltoft. They would then get three more blocks and a pair of kills each from Reeg and Lindsey Brown to take the set 25-22

The Top 50, selected by voting on GoJacks.com and the 50 Years of Women's Athletics Committee, include all 12 members of the Jackrabbit Sports Hall of Fame, 5 individual national champions and 7 Academic All-Americans. Additionally, the Top 50 have been named All-Americans 56 times.

Yankton native Ketty (Cornemann) Paula was named to the list as an all-around athlete. Primarily known for her basketball prowess, she also competed in volleyball and track and field at ŠDSU. On the basketball court, she was a team captain for two seasons and was a part of WNIT and NCAA Tournament runs for the Jacks.

She is currently an assistant coach at South Dakota Mines.

Parkston native Kelli Fiegen was a dominant force on the volleyball court for the Jackrabbits from 2008-2012, finishing her career sixth on the team's all-time kills list with 1,407.
