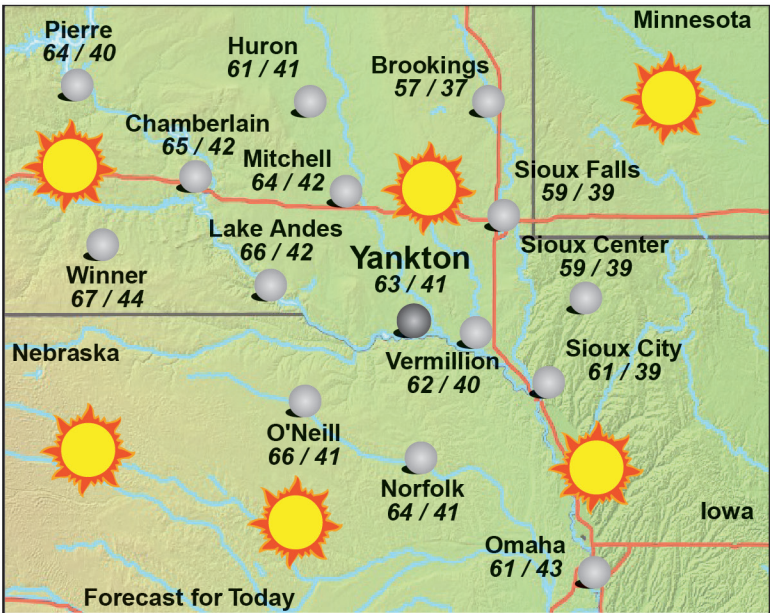

• Yankton County registered 1,685 men between the ages of 21 and 36 in the first peacetime conscription in the history of the United States, which was held yesterday in the 27 election precincts of the county and an additional registration place at Yankton College.
• An important business deal was concluded here yesterday when the E.P. Fitzgerald Motor Co., a corporation, transferred its Ford agency here to the Tague-Anderson Motor Co., a co-partnership, the new company being composed of Arthur Tague and James W. Anderson, who have leased the Fitzgerald Company.

U.S. stocks closed higher Friday, marking the third straight week of gains for the market. Investors mostly focused on the latest company earnings news as they searched for insight into how the global economy is doing. Health care and consumer staple stocks were among the biggest risers.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for December delivery declined 10.25 cents to \$4.9225 a bushel; December corn was up 1.25 cents to 3.7675 a bushel; December oats fell 3.75 cents to 2.3075 a bushel; while November soybeans lost 7 cents to \$8.9825 a bushel.
Beef was higher and pork was lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was up 2.87 cents to \$1.3942 a pound; November feeder cattle rose 4.25 cents to \$1.9015 a pound; while December lean hogs was off 1.25 cents to \$6.558 a pound.
