## KNOX CO. SHERIFF'S REPORT

The driver, Tabitha Schmit, lost control of her 2002 Pontiac. Schmit's vehicle entered the south ditch and then rolled three times before coming to rest back on its wheels. Schmit was transported to the Osmond General Hospital by the Wausa Rescue. Schmit's passenger Racheal Hubers was taken to the Osmond General Hospital by private vehicle. Both were treated and released for minor injuries because seatbelts were in use at the time of the accident.

\* On Oct. 16, 2015, about 8:15 a.m., the Knox County Sheriff's office investigated a car/deer accident about a quarter-mile south of the Highway 84 and Highway 13 junction. A 2013 Chevy Malibu, driven by Carrie Williamson of Creighton, was traveling north on Highway 13 when a deer crossed the highway in front of her. The vehicle received damage to the front end of the vehicle and passenger fender. The front and side airbags all deployed. Seatbelt was in use. The vehicle was totaled and had to be towed from the scene. Drivers are reminded that not only is there
