KNOX CO. SHERIFF'S REPORT

The driver, Tabitha Schmit, lost control of her 2002 Pontiac. Schmit's vehicle entered the south ditch and then rolled three times before coming to rest back on its wheels. Schmit was transported to the Osmond General hospital by the Wausa Rescue, Schmit's passenger Racheal Hubers was taken to the Osmond General Hospital by private vehicle. Both were treated and released for minor injuries because seatbelts were in use at the time of the accident.
