# **Commentary: Bucks, Tigers To Face Off For Second Seed**

Thursday's Yankton at Harrisburg football game could very likely decide the second seed in the upcoming Class 11AA football playoffs. Enter-

ing the final week of play, Yankton (5-3) has a slight edge over Harrisburg (5-3) in



the state's seed CIMBUREK points rankings (also

called power points), 42.5 to 42.125. Pierre (6-2) is a clear top seed at 43.125. Mitchell (5-3, 41.75) could slip ahead of the loser of the Yankton-Harrisburg game.

Yankton and Harrisburg had two spirited battles a year ago, both won by the Bucks. But both teams are drastically different from their 2014 versions. Regardless, it should be another exciting game between the programs.

Here is a look at the playoff picture for our other area teams. Post-season for Class 11AAA, 11AA and 11A teams begin on Oct. 29, while 11B and 9-man teams begin post-season play on Oct. 27. State finals are set for Nov. 12-14 at the DakotaDome in Vermillion.

### Class 11A

Both Vermillion (1-7) and Dakota Valley (1-7) are likely to miss the playoffs, as they currently sit 14th and 16th. Eight teams qualify in Class 11A

## Class 11B

Beresford (4-4) has completed its regular season and should be in good shape to

advance. Parkston (4-3) enters the week as fourth in its region, but sitting in the top "wild card" spot. The Trojans host Groton (6-1), and should advance to the post-season regardless of the outcome.

Wagner (1-6) and Elk Point-Jefferson (0-7) are not likely to qualify for state. Wagner is 7th among potential wild card teams (4 qualify), while EPJ is 10th.

## Class 9AA

Bon Homme (5-2), in its first season of 9-man competition, sits in good shape for a wild card berth, sitting in first among teams outside the top three in each region. The Cavaliers face a tough Canistota (7-0) team to end

the regular season.

Class 9A

In Region 3, Scotland (6-1) has virtually locked up the top seed. Andes Central-Dakota Christian (2-5) sits in second and finishes against Marty (0-7), but is just a fraction of a point ahead of Hanson (3-4).

Tripp-Delmont-Armour (1-6), Marty, Platte-Geddes (1-6) and Menno-Marion (0-6) are currently on the outside looking in, with TDA having an outside chance to qualify if it beats Burke-South Central (4-3).

In Region 2, Gayville-Volin (4-3) and Parker (5-2) are in a battle for third and fourth. GV hosts Corsica-Stickney, while Parker travels to unbeaten Chester Area (7-0). Irene-Wakonda (3-4) sits as the "first team out" of the wild card picture, and needs

a win at home against Baltic and some help to qualify for the post-season.

# Class 9B

Alcester-Hudson (5-2) leads Region 2 and hosts Centerville (0-7) to finish the regular season. Avon (2-6) is in 6th in the wild card standings. With its

season complete, it would need a little help for its season to be extended.

Centerville will not likely qualify for post-season play.

# Nebraska

Post-season play in Nebraska begins Oct. 29 for 8-man and Oct. 30 for 11-man. Championships are set for Nov. 23 and 24 in Lincoln.

Class C2 Crofton (6-2), despite

a victory over Hartington Cedar Catholic last week, is currently the second team out in Class C2. A win over West Holt (7-1) this week could put the Warriors into

the playoffs. Cedar Catholic (4-4) is the fifth team out in C2 and would need a win at Ainsworth (2-6) and some help to make a return to the postseason.

## Class D1

Creighton (7-0) ranks second in the state and should have no problem making the post-season, regardless of their outcome against Hartington-Newcastle (1-6). Bloomfield (4-3) is the 31st team in the rankings (32 qualify). While both the Bees and Plainview (4-3) are currently in the playoff picture, the loser might get knocked out of this tightly-packed

division. Niobrara-Verdigre (1-6)

and Hartington-Newcastle are not likely to make the postseason.

## Class D2

Wynot (6-1) sits sixth overall in the Class and should be in regardless of this week's outcome against Lyons-Decatur Northeast (5-2). Randolph (5-2) should also be in good shape, currently in 16th entering this week's matchup at Osmond (6-1)

Állen (3-4) is on the bubble, the third team out and needing a win over Bancroft-Rosalie (0-7) – and possibly some help - to advance. Wausa (0-7) is unlikely to advance.

# **USD's Biltoft, Jessen Named Summit League Players Of The Week**

ELMHURST, Ill. — Senior middle blocker Kelsey Biltoft and sophomore setter Brittany Jessen earned Summit League Defensive and Offensive Player of the Week honors, as released on Monday.

Biltoft receives her first career week award. She registered 17 total blocks during the week, including eight in a four-set home win over IUPUI. The eight blocks matches her season high and marks the

fifth-straight game that Biltoft has recorded more than five total blocks. She averaged 1.70 blocks per set in leading the Coyotes to a 2-1 record during the week. Biltoft is averaging 1.10 blocks per set on the season, which is the third best in the Summit League.

'Kelsey has worked really hard to improve her block," said South Dakota head coach Leanne Wil-

defense, and she did a tremendous job of being a presence at the net. She is driven to make an impact, and she did just that this week.'

Jessen receives her first career week award. She recorded 124 assists over three league matches, including 58 in a four-set win over IUPUI. Her 58 assists, ranks 13th in the program's history for most assists in four sets. Jessen has five liamson. "She is that first part of our matches this season with at least 50

assists and a streak of 17 matches with at least 30 assists. She averaged 12.40 assists per set, nearly two assists above her season average. Jessen currently ranks second in the Summit League with 10.56 assists per set.
