USD's Eichkom Earns

Second Straight SL Honor
ELMHURST, Ill.—South Dakota senior Amber Eichkom earned her second consecutive Summit League Women's Cross Country Athlete of the Week for the period ended Oct. 18, as released by the league office Tuesday.

Eichkom collects her fifth career athlete of the week honor and third of the season. The Wichita, Kan., native won the Bradley Pink Classic by 16 seconds with a personal-best 6,000-meter time of 20:11.8. Eichkom topped the field of 267 runners to record her third individual victory of the season.

Eichkom holds the top Summit League times in the 4,000 and 5,000 meters this fall. She posted the second-fastest league 6,000-meter time at Bradley.

The Coyotes toe the line for the Summit League Championships on Oct. 31 in Brookings.

WAHIAWA, Hawaii—The South Dakota State women's golf team shot a nine-over par 297 and is in third place after the first round of the Rainbow Wahine Invitational hosted by the University of Hawaii.

The Jackrabbits are three shots behind Mississippi (294) and two behind 34th-ranked Brigham Young (295) on the 6,228-yard, par-72 Leilehua Golf Course in Schofield Barracks.

Junior Megan Mingo (Yankton) is tied for second after firing a two-under par 70. She collected three birdies and a bogey in the round.

Junior Hallie Getz (Pierre) shot a one-over par 73 with three birdies to tie for 11th while sophomore Natcha Smaneeerungroj (Bangkok, Thailand) is tied for 25th after shooting a four-over par 76 with three birdies.

Senior Brianna Janu (Glenwood, Minn.) is tied for 43rd (78) and classmate Sydney MacDonald (Calgary, Alberta) is tied for 51st (79).

Women's Golf: Coyotes Third At Creighton Classic

OMAHA, Neb.—South Dakota placed two golfers in the top five and finished third of eight teams at the Creighton Classic held Monday and Tuesday at Oak Hills Country Club. The 36-hole event featured 50 players.

Coyote junior Brenna Lervick and freshman Jennifer Vincent tied for fourth place at 10-over-par. It was the third top-five finish in four events this fall for Lervick and the first such finish for Vincent. Lervick entered the final round tied for first following Monday's 4-over 76 while Vincent posted a 78. The two flipped scorecards Tuesday to finish at 154.

Drake, behind medalist Madison Glennie, earned an eight-stroke victory over North Dakota to take the team title. The Bulldogs were in third place, four strokes behind South Dakota, after round one, but shot 305 Tuesday which was eight strokes better than the rest of the field. The Coyotes finished two strokes behind North Dakota in a tie for third place with Bellevue at 643.

Glennie, who was tied with Lervick for the lead after round one, shot an even-par 72 Tuesday. She finished three strokes better than Jenna Janu of North Dakota who finished at 7-over. Concordia's Rachel Gray was third at 9-over.

In addition to Lervick and Vincent, Abby Dufrane (20th, 166), Victoria Grasso (29th, 169) and Kaitlyn Krzyzanowski (40th, 177) competed for South Dakota. Freshman Lexi Peterson competed individually and finished in 35th place with a score of 173.

The Classic was the fourth of five fall events for South Dakota. The Coyotes compete at UAB's Fall Beach Blast Nov. 2-3 in Gulf Shores, Ala.
