400 USD and SDSU Students Hone Interprofessional Health Care Skills

VERMILLION — More than 400 students from the University of South Dakota and South Dakota State University spent Tuesday, Oct. 20, on the Vermillion campus of USD learning teamwork skills in the evolving concept known as interprofessional health care. That approach emphasizes that health care professionals from different disciplines need to work closely together to improve patient outcomes. For example, a social worker, physical therapist and nurse confer, communicate and cooperate with the physician as a team when deciding how to treat someone. Students and faculty taking part in the day-long exercises are from SDSU's College of Pharmacy; USD's College of Arts & Sciences, which includes audiology, speech language pathology and clinical psychology; the USD Sanford School of Medicine's medical program and center for disabilities; USD's School of Health Sciences, which includes addiction studies, dental hygiene, medical laboratory science, nursing, occupational therapy, physician assistant, physical therapy, public health, social work and health sciences major. "The event, which started in 1999, provides the students a great chance to interact with and learn about other health professionals, and how they can work together to provide team-based care," said Joy Karges, professor of physical therapy and Chair of the inter-professional training event at USD. "This is an important event in the development of health care professionals in South Dakota, setting standards for interprofessional health sciences education and practice," added Michael Lawler, Ph.D., dean of USD's School of Health Sciences, which is leading a statewide effort that's unique in the United States because it blends government, education and health institutions to advance interprofessionalism. Thousands Now Use IRS Direct Pay, Make Tax Payments From Home

DENVER — Thousands of taxpayers are now using the successful web-based system — IRS Direct Pay — on IRS.gov, which lets taxpayers pay their tax bills or make estimated tax payments directly from checking or savings accounts without any fees or pre-registration. "It saves time and gets you out of traffic," said Karen Connelly, an IRS spokesperson in Denver. "IRS Direct Pay is just part of our effort to add more online tools to help taxpayers. It allows you to make a payment from the convenience of a home computer—no need to drive to a local IRS office just to make a payment." Introduced in 2014, more than a million tax payments have already been made through the IRS Direct Pay system. With IRS Direct Pay, taxpayers receive instant confirmation that the payment has been submitted, and the system is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Bank account information is not retained in IRS systems after payments are made. From the "Pay Your Tax Bill" icon at the top of the IRS home page, taxpayers can access IRS Direct Pay, which walks the taxpayer through five simple steps. The steps include providing your tax information, verifying your identity, entering your payment information, reviewing and electronically signing and recording your online confirmation. Connelly said IRS Direct Pay offers 30-day advance payment scheduling, payment rescheduling or cancellations, and a payment status search. Direct Pay cannot be used to pay business taxes. Taxpayers who wish to e-pay their federal business taxes should enroll in the Electronic Federal Tax Payment System (EFTPS), or click on the "Pay Your Tax Bill" icon on IRS.gov to check out other payment options.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher higher Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery gained 3.5 cents to \$4.9475 a bushel; December corn was up 4 cents to 3.8075 a bushel; December oats rose 3 cents to 2.2775 a bushel; while November soybeans gained 9.25 cents to \$9.0525 a bushel. Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was .02 cent lower to \$1.4315 a pound; November feeder cattle fell .103 cents to \$1.9142 a pound; while December lean hogs declined .83 cent to \$.6702 a pound.

75 YEARS AGO

Tuesday, October 22, 1940

John Wooley, deputy state fire marshal, and Chief William F. Schwenk, of Yankton fire department, made inspections of the public schools of the city this forenoon, pulling fire alarms for test evacuations of buildings and making physical inspections of the structures as to fire hazards.

The city has entered into a contract with Ulysses Schlueter of Norfolk, Neb., for the removal of a gumbo point on the high willow bar in the Missouri opposite the city water plant as one of the means of diverting a portion of the main channel of the river, which is now on the Nebraska side.

50 YEARS AGO

Friday, October 22, 1965

Amid the cheering of several hundred Yankton High School students and a number of interested townspeople, Miss Judy Link, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Link, and Pete Johnson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Johnson, emerged as princess and chief of Arickara homecoming festivities.

The Viet Cong made another strong attack on the beleaguered Special Forces camp at Plei today, but the fighting died down again late in the day, a U.S. military spokesman reported. The Communist guerrillas shot down a U.S. Air Force Skyraider, but the pilot was rescued.

25 YEARS AGO

Monday, October 22, 1990

An additional day of activity has been added to the lineup for Mount Marty College's 13th annual Oktoberfest Saturday and Sunday on the MMC campus. "We want to offer something for all ages and interest," said Sister Martin Mergen, chairman of the event.

Dakota Days in Vermillion was much calmer than in past years, with about one-third fewer arrests than in 1989, according to Police Chief Gary Wright. He credits the rainy weather as well as competing homecomings at South Dakota State University and Sioux Falls College.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks closed lower on Wednesday, weighed down by a slide in energy stocks as the price of oil tumbled. Investors sifted through the latest company earnings and deal news. Yahoo slumped 5 percent after reporting a steep drop in a closely watched measure of revenue. Other big companies, including General Motors, delivered better earnings than Wall Street was expecting.
