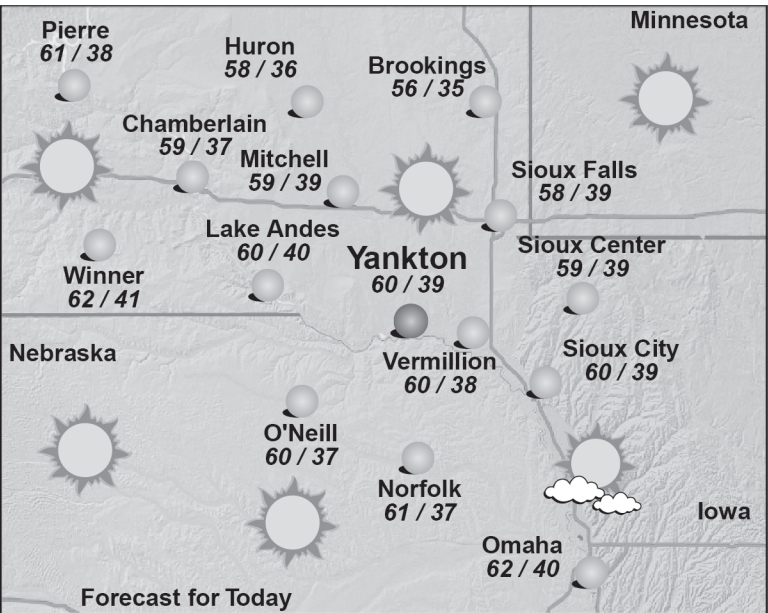

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mixed Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for December delivery lost .25 cent to \$4.9050 a bushel; December corn was up 1.50 cents to 3.7975 a bushel; December oats rose 2.75 cents to 2.2775 a bushel; while November soybeans fell 3.25 cents to \$8.9550 a bushel. Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was .35 cent lower to \$1.4340 a pound; November feeder cattle fell 1 cent to \$1.9325 a pound; while December lean hogs declined 2.85 cents to \$6.360 a pound.

WALL ST. RECAP

A surge in big-name technology shares helped push U.S. stocks higher on Friday. The gain pushed the Standard & Poor's 500 index back into the black for the year. Microsoft, Amazon and Google's parent company Alphabet closed sharply higher after each released surprisingly strong results the day before. **FOR THE DAY:** The Dow Jones industrial average gained 157.54 points, or 0.9 percent, to close at 17,646.70. The S&P's 500 index added 22.64 points, or 1.1 percent, to 2,075.15. The Nasdaq composite rose 111.81 points, or 2.3 percent, to 5,031.86. **FOR THE WEEK:** The Dow is up 430.73 points, or 2.5 percent. The S&P 500 index is up 42.04 points, or 2.1 percent. The Nasdaq is up 145.18 points, or 3 percent. **FOR THE YEAR:** The Dow is down 176.37 points, or 1 percent. The S&P 500 index is up 16.25 points, or 0.8 percent. The Nasdaq is up 295.81 points, or 6.3 percent.
