CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were lower Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery was off 3.25 cents to \$5.06 a bushel; September corn was off 4 cents to 3.76 a bushel; December oats were .25 cent lower to 2.27 a bushel; while November soybeans declined 9.75 cents to \$8.8150 bushel.

Beef and pork were higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. December live cattle was up 3 cents to \$1.4360 a pound; November feeder cattle gained 4.50 cents to \$1.9225 a pound; while December lean hogs were .15 cent higher at \$6.140 a pound.

• The Yankton Gazelles eased past the visiting Brookings Lady Bobcats Saturday night, thanks in part to an impressive 12 point first quarter run, taking a 71/46 Eastern South Dakota Conference victory.
• A pair of environmental issues dealing with large-scale landfills and Black Hills mining are to be decided by South Dakota voters next week. Both proposals were placed on the Nov. 6 ballot after a successful petition drive by a group called the Surface Mining Initiative Fund.
