Lakeport Church Celebration Set For Sept. 12

The 27th annual celebration of the state's oldest standing chalk-stone church, Lakeport or St. John the Baptist Catholic, begins with a 10:30 a.m. mass there on Sunday, Sept. 12. The general public is invited to attend. This year the dedication will be to the little town of Janousek. A potluck meal follows at the American Legion Hall in Tabor.

The church, located 10 miles west of Yankton along Highway 50, is also the last remaining building of what was once the village of Lakeport. St. John the Baptist Catholic Church was built in 1884 — one of a number of buildings erected by Czech immigrants who settled in the Lakeport area in 1869.

Rev. Joseph Puthenkulathil, priest of St. Wenceslaus Church, Tabor, will celebrate the special mass on Sunday, Sept. 12. Lakeport was located along the Sioux City to Ft. Randall Military Road. The famed General Custer camped there. Other military passed through there also, some as early as 1856.

As Czech immigrants settled there, they established a post office, church, school, hotel, community center and other businesses.

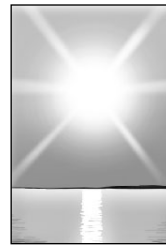
Men's Fraternity Course Starts This Week

As I was on my way to the office this morning I was driving down Broadway as I usually do. Suddenly a car pulls out in front of me causing me to apply my brakes in order to keep my car from getting to know the other car better. This type of thing happens, but what made it significantly more trying was that the other driver seemed to be in the process of trying to light a cigarette rather than truly paying attention to road. Now as a member of the Christian clergy I ought to have given thanks to God for delivering me from a potential accident, asked God to help the other driver be more alert and prayed for the safety of all drivers. That is what I should have done, but if I am being honest, some unchristian thoughts are what flashed through my newly stressed out mind instead.

There are times I find myself not being courteous behind the wheel and not explaining my neighbors actions in the kindest possible way. The greatest irony to all of this is that occasionally I will make a driving mistake or do something which I am sure would cause my fellow drivers some stress. When we make driving mistakes we tend to feel a little bad and then shrug it off, but when someone else makes a similar mistake or shows a lack of patience behind the wheel many of us have a tendency to slip into road rage. Road rage seems to have become somewhat socially acceptable. It is not that it is encouraged but it is experienced by so many that it is considered normal, assuming

the rage does not cause violence. But this is not right. Road rage, that which causes us to think bad thoughts about, or do bad things to, our neighbor is wrong and a sin. Anytime we think ill of our neighbor or anytime we put our own will ahead of others we are guilty of sinning. And sinning in any form, even in the mundane, needs repentance and a commitment to not repeat the action again.

I write this article not to "preach" to you readers, but in order to address a problem which I have found myself guilty of participating in. Imagine how much better it would be if all of us drivers took the time to be courteous on the road. Imagine how much safer it would be if we all looked out for our neighbor. Imagine how blessed we would all be if instead of showing anger we showed forgiveness to one another.

May God bless us all, keep us safe on the road and give us the ability to show Christ's love both in and out of our vehicles.
